## Fishing Season Opens Here

General Oregon fishing season will open April 14, but Klamath county areas will remain closed until May 12, according to the 1945 fishing synopsis released today. The listed areas and the synopsis as pertains to this county is as follows:

**General Season and Bag Limits**  
Species and Size—Trout not less than 8 inches and salmon and steelhead under 20 inches except jack salmon.  
Season—April 14 to October 31, all except Lake county.  
Limit—15 fish or 15 pounds and 1 fish but not more than 30 pounds or 30 pounds fish in 7 consecutive days or in possession one time.  
Species and Size—Trout not less than 10 inches and salmon and steelhead under 20 inches except jack salmon.  
Season—Entire year in tidewater and those streams and listed on page 2 of synopsis.  
Limit—3 fish in 1 day but not more than 6 fish in 7 consecutive days during period from November 1 to April 13. Remainder of year bag limit is the same as and is to be included in limit for trout not less than 8 inches.  
Species and Size—Salmon and steelhead 20 inches or over.  
Season—Entire year in all counties. (See exceptions by counties and under Rogue river). Found in synopsis.  
Limit—3 fish in the aggregate in 1 day but not more than 6 fish in 7 consecutive days or in possession one time.  
Species and Size—Salmon under 20 inches—open entire year in all counties bag limit.  
NOTE—The above bag limits are to be counted separately as otherwise specified.

## KLAMATH COUNTY Special Seasons and Bag Limits:

**Upper Klamath river, October 1 to July 31, inclusive.**  
Spencer creek, April 14 to September 30, inclusive. Bag limit 10 pounds and 1 fish but not to exceed 10 fish in any 7 consecutive days and 2 fish but not to exceed 20 fish in any 7 consecutive days.  
Upper Klamath and Agency lakes, May 12 to September 31, inclusive; provided, however, the open season is the year in that portion of Upper Klamath lake from Modoc to Eagle Ridge south to Link river.  
Link river and Lake Ewauna, open season the entire year. Bag limit 5 fish in any 1 day but not more than 15 pounds and 1 fish but not to exceed 30 pounds and 2 fish in any 7 consecutive days. Other lake in Klamath county, May 12 to September 20, inclusive.  
Link river, July 1 to October 31, inclusive.

## CLOSED TO ALL ANGLING:

Part of Klamath river for a distance of 4000 feet below 100 feet above the mouth of Spencer creek.

Part of Odell creek from Odell lake downstream to a where the line of telephone poles runs east and west across creek, adjacent to the forestry camp.  
Part of Link river beginning at the California Oregon company's dam on said river to a point 200 feet below dam.
