

# KUHS Will Compete In Hayward Relays

Coch Paul Deller and 15 Pelican cindermen will travel to Eugene Saturday to compete in the Hayward relays. Deller is entering the Klamath speedsters in nine events including shot put relays, 3-mile relays, sprint medley, distance medley, shuttle hurdle relays, and two single events, the pole vault and the discus.

Lanky Jim Palmer is the top Pelican in the pole vault event and Ben DeVore will weave the discus for the Klamath squad. These are the only two single events in which KUHS will be entered.

The results of the relays are reached by adding the combined time or distance of the boys participating in each event.

**Top Distance Men**  
Herbert Barker and Leonard Quam are excellent distance men and Dave Henthorne is the lad to watch in the sprints. Henthorne will run in the anchor position in any relays in which he is entered, Deller said.

This meet is one of the top track and field attractions of the season and probably 25 schools will be represented. If the Pelican

can trackmen place high in the standings, it will be indicative of the ability of the Klamath speedsters as compared to other schools in the state, and Deller is confident that the boys will finish well above the average.

The quadrangular meet scheduled for Medford last Saturday has been postponed indefinitely, Deller stated.
