And through it all ran a priceless sense of humor culled from the world tragedy of the places where he walked. One illustration from one of his last columns is enough. In this column he said how he had been sent a jacket with a big US spray on the back and how, that night around the fire on Okinawa, one of the marines remarked:

"You know, when you first showed up, we saw that big samurai tony on your back and after you passed, I said to the others: 'That guy's an admiral. Look at the old, gray-haired bastard. He's been in the navy all his life. He'll get a medal out of this, sure as hell.'"

Only Ernie Pyle would think of putting that story in a column.
