

STATE HEADS DEMAND POST-WAR RIGHTS

RENO, Nev., April 23 (AP)—A demand for peacetime return to the states of war-lost functions and rights will be carried to Washington as outgrowth of the two-day conference of governors and representatives of the 11 western states and Alas-

ka. Sessions closed here Saturday night. Named to present the demand, along with other conference recommendations, at the nation's capital were Governors Mon C. Wallgren of Washington, John J. Dempsey of New Mexico and John C. Vivian of Colorado. Site of the next meeting in November will be Cheyenne, Wyo., with Gov. Lester Hunt of that state as chairman. Action was delayed here on endorsement of a reclamation policy, Alaskan statehood, revision of banking laws, adjustment of freight rates on western products and a joint program on attracting tourist trade. The state executives voted to urge federal agencies, in charge of war industry and mining contract cancellations, to fur-

nish contractors with sufficient prior notice so that discharged workers may receive prompt payment of wages.

CHILD FALLS FROM MOVING AUTO

Dennis E. Ausranc, three-and-one-half year old son of Mr. and Mrs. Francis E. Ausranc of Lindley Heights, fell from a car to the pavement on Friday afternoon and was immediately rushed to Klamath Valley hospital for treatment for bruises and lacerations. The car was going quite slowly at the time of the accident and he was not hurt seriously. Dennis was allowed to go home after being given emergency treatment and is reported to be recovering nicely.

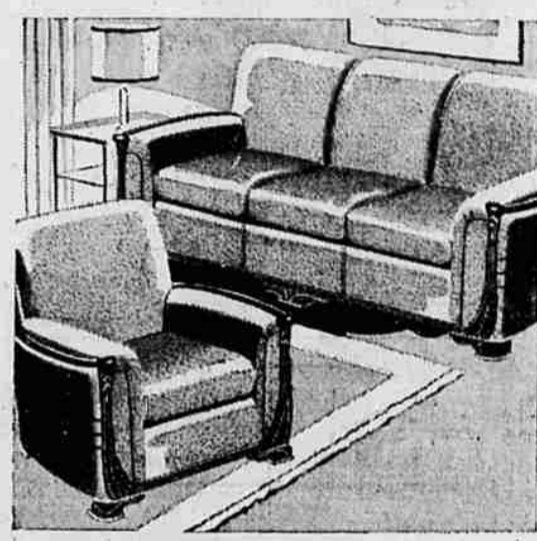

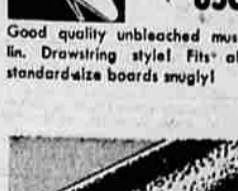

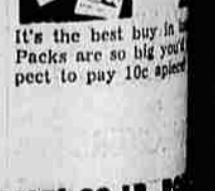
