nine-car convoy. He was in the first car with his wife. The aged marshal did not leave his automobile during the frontier deliberations, which required about an hour. Dressed in civilian clothes with a grey topcoat, he seemed tired. However, he waved to the crowd as he drove away to Saint Gallen, where he and his party presently are housed. **SS Trooper Escort** One car of German SS troopers, presumably escorting the marshal, turned back at the frontier. A daughter and son-in-law of the aged marshal followed in a second car of the convoy. Gen. Marie Eugene Debency, commander of the French first army in the First World war and a close confidant of Petain, was among those in the party. (The Vichy radio reported on November 10, 1943, that Debency had died of wounds suffered two months previously when French guerrillas hid a bomb in his automobile.)

Senate Bars Use Of Young Soldiers

WASHINGTON, April 24 (AP)—The senate adopted an amendment today to the selective service extension bill barring the use of 18-year-olds in combat until trained at least six months. The vote was 50 to 25 in favor of the proposal sponsored by Senators Stewart (GK-D-Tenn.), Johnson (D-Colo.), Revercomb (R-W.Va.), and Wilson (R-Ia.). It was written in despite strong opposition from the war and navy departments.

Press, Advertising Leader Dies

TACOMA, April 24 (AP)—Carl H. Getz, 54, Tacoma-born newspaper and advertising man, whose outstanding career ended eight years ago with his retirement, died yesterday at the home of his sister, Agnes A. Getz, here.

Getz attended schools here and graduated from the University of Washington where he became professor of journalism. In New York City he became advertising executive of several nationally known concerns. He had made several trips around the world as business secretary of the late Walter P. Chrysler of the Chrysler corporation. His retirement was forced by ill health.

He is survived by his widow, Carol, in New York; his sister and two nephews, Alfred C. Getz of Tacoma and Clifford C. Getz, of Oakland, Calif.

Lumber Worker Breaks Leg, Record

W. B. Bickers, 65-year-old Lamm Lumber company employe, broke more than his leg Monday when he stepped on a small pebble while at work dismantling the mill. This was the first time in 17 years that Bickers was off the job, a record of which he was proud.
