

# Division Director Urges Bond Buying

A plea to all women's organizations in the state of Oregon to buy their war bond buying particularly during the 7th War Loan drive was made recently by Mrs. Rogers MacVeagh, newly appointed director of the women's division of the Oregon war finance committee.

Mrs. MacVeagh arrived in Klamath Falls several weeks ago, accompanied by Miss Mabelle B. Blake, in connection with the 7th War Loan, which in Klamath county, is being sponsored by the Soroptimist club and the Business and Professional Women's club.

In addition to doing everything possible in the regular savings program, Mrs. MacVeagh states that the "dream" of the women's division is "a pin-money war stamp book in every purse and pocket" and "every baby in Oregon a bond owner." The pin-money project and bond for babies are two of the major concerns of the state division.

Mrs. MacVeagh, who succeeds Mrs. Sadie Orr Dunbar as division director, has been assistant director since June of 1944. She previously served as executive secretary for the annual campaign for the "March of Dimes," and as women's counselor at the Swan Island shipyard at Portland.

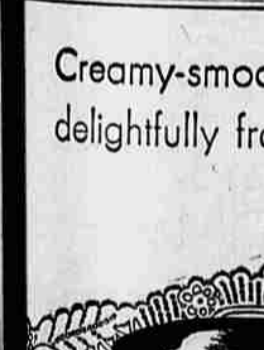
## WILL WED

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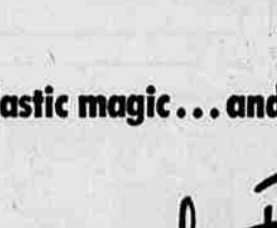
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
