ADDED FUNDS FOR PRODUCTS LAB GRANTED

WASHINGTON, April 28 (AP) — Present methods of harvesting the nation's timber were described to the house by Rep. Ellsworth (R-Ore.) as reminiscent of practices that drove the buffalo to extinction.

Ellsworth and Angell (R-Ore.) teamed up with members from the northern forested states to win a 25-vote margin for an increase in appropriations for the forest products laboratory.

"The only way we can find out how a greater utilization of these trees can be made is by research," Ellsworth told the house in debate on a senate amendment which raised the laboratory appropriation from \$1,001,380 to \$1,228,900.

The additional money, he said, would be used for supporting wood utilization plants. The forest products laboratory, he said, will use a large part of the additional funds for applying the results of war research to peacetime uses.
