

# 4-H CLUBS TO HOLD ANNUAL FAIRS IN AREA

Community 4-H club fairs are to be held during this week and next throughout Klamath county in the same fashion as last year. The club projects to be displayed at these fairs are clothing, backer sewing, cooking, home-making, knitting, forestry and wood-working.

Albion school displayed exhibits Tuesday in the gymnasium. Elementary school will have the judging at 10 a. m. May 3 and a clothing style review at 2 p. m. with a bachelor sewing show thereafter. The awarding of leadership pins will end this program after which the regular PTA meeting will be held.

May 4 at 10 a. m. is the time set for the Shasta school community fair, with a program at 2 p. m. followed by a social with refreshments. Main school will hold the judging of its various club projects on May 6 at 10 a. m.

Fairhaven school district will display its club projects at 2 p. m. on May 6, after which visitors and parents are invited to see what the 4-H members have accomplished during the school year. Roosevelt school children are to be dismissed at 2:30 p. m. on May 9 in order to see the exhibit of the 4-H clubs to be held in the home economics room.

On May 10 Keno school will hold its fair at which time the projects will also be judged. By 4-H members will have their projects judged on May 10 and hold their fair on the following day at graduation exercises.

Maryville Square of the state club office in Corvallis will be on hand to judge all the foregoing displays.

Gilchrist school expects to hold its fair May 10 at which time local judges will preside. In the afternoon of May 18, Mrs. Winnifred Gillen of the Klamath Falls home demonstration office will judge the exhibits in the Merrill school.

## FOOD PROGRAM POLICY URGED BY COMMITTEE

WASHINGTON, May 2 (AP)—A house investigating committee sharply criticizing many phases of the government's food program, today recommended a coordinated policy from grower to consumer to break up black markets and ease shortages.

The committee, set up by the house six weeks ago, concluded its initial report with these recommendations:

1. That food production be given top priority of the war production board including adequate manpower and machinery for farms.
2. That President Truman be urged to "immediately consider the problem of needed coordination of the entire food program." (Republican members added a demand for a single food authority instead of the several government agencies now concerned with food.)
3. That pricing be revised to assure profit margins to growers, producers and distributors, with special incentives to cattle feeders.
4. That the support price of beef be boosted from \$13 to \$15.50 a hundred pounds, Chicago basis.
5. Special inducement programs to ward off a developing threat of black markets in eggs and sugar.

"It will take more than half-way measures to obtain additional meat for the people and stop black market operations," the report said.

"There must be action now. The price line is weakening. It must be held. Time is working on the side of scarcity, and if time is wasted and coordination of the food program is not achieved, black markets will have cracked price control irreparably."

The committee made no direct denunciation of OPA, praised by President Truman yesterday, or of other government agencies handling food. But in carefully chosen words it criticized many phases of the food program and blamed its operations directly for the spread of black markets in meat.

It attacked particularly the 10-point revision of food policies announced two weeks ago by OPA, the war food administration and the office of economic stabilization.

### Crater Lake Snow Wetter This Year

Snow at Crater lake this year holds eight inches more water than the snow which fell the previous winter, according to a soil conservation service report. Water content of the snow, rather than depth of drift determines irrigation and stream supply for the coming season, it was pointed out. Water content of park snows increased an inch last month, although snow depth decreased nearly 30 inches.

## DAMAGE SUIT FILED ON MERRILL LEASE

Suit was filed in circuit court Monday by F. W. Tanner vs. H. M. Watkins and H. M. Clark, seeking to recover damages on four counts in connection with leasing of crop lands in the Merrill district.

The plaintiff charged that on November 15, 1943, he leased the land to Watkins and Clark, including 680 acres. The defendants are said to have agreed to sow 300 acres each year in wheat, keep all buildings in repair and to maintain the property. Tanner seeks \$588.85 for his crop share, \$100 for damages and \$180 for failure to keep up the buildings, plus \$15

costs. F. O. Small is attorney for the plaintiff.

J. D. Long filed suit against John Brennan and W. R. Cahoon, doing business as Brennan and Cahoon, seeking \$175 due him for rental of a truck and \$90 for damages to the vehicle. U. S. Balentine is attorney for the plaintiff.
