April, 1945, was warmer than April, 1944, and colder than April, 1943, according to records of the bureau of reclamation. The highest temperature for April this year occurred on the 19th and 30th, when the thermometer reached 77 degrees. The mean monthly temperature for the month was 45.1 degrees, 1.6 degrees warmer than for April, 1944, and 4.5 degrees colder than April, 1943.
