Jury Criticizes Three Institutions

PORTLAND, May 5 (AP)—Surprise visits of the county grand jury to the Multnomah county farm, city jail, and Frazier home for boys today had resulted in sharp criticism of all three institutions.

Besting care and medical attention given elderly patients at the farm as "entirely too impersonal and inadequate." Jurors demanded correction of the system. They reported agricultural and livestock conditions satisfactory. Other recommendations were for the prompt attention to patients' dental needs and a dietician for diabetic cases.

The city jail was described as in "deplorable condition." The jury condemned lack of privacy for women prisoners.

The boys' home was termed a "fire trap."
