

WARM WEATHER RECORDED ALL OVER OREGON

PORTLAND, May 10 (AP)—The season's warmest weather recorded in Oregon last week, with the mercury climbing to the 80s in nearly every part, the weather bureau reported today.

Highest temperature was Portland's 91 degrees. Only a few points recorded early morning readings below the freezing mark.

Field work was well under way during the week, the bureau said, although some eastern and central areas were rather too dry for plowing. Mountain snow melted considerably, increasing the runoff; more irrigation was required during the week.

The weekly crop-weather survey showed winter grain making good growth, though it will need rain in many eastern areas. Farmers continued seeding grain and began general planting.

The weather bureau also reported:

Fruit: Apples blooming extensively in elevated areas; some damage showing in cherries and apricots; berries ripening extensively; conditions favorable for prunes.

Livestock: Good condition; eating well along in warmer areas, hay crops backward but improving; pastures generally improving, though in need of rain at many points.

Vegetables: Early potatoes coming up well, but will be later than usual; lettuce and beans being thinned; unusually early thinning of sugar beets; flax thinning; fiber flax coming up well; hops being trained.
