Instead of being hospitalized, he carries on and so helps to break the cycle of the disease. A relatively great altitude minimizes danger of reinfection. Exercise encourages appetite, he gets plenty of the best blood-building food and his blood carries on the fight to a successful conclusion against the disease-causing organisms which have invaded it.

Now and then there are tolerance tests, which might be roughly described as endurance tests, such as long hikes under full pack. The boys will tell you these are "pretty rugged." They show the extent to which the individual is being built up which, in turn, is somewhat of an index to the progress he is making against the disease. He practices and competes in basketball, baseball, football, does weight lifting, bowls, swims, dances, drills, attends classes which run all the way from specialized combat instruction to

SGT. ROBERT LILLY GIVEN BRONZE STAR

T/Sgt. Robert J. Lilly, son of Mr. and Mrs. Jesse Lilly, now of Ashland, has been awarded the Bronze Star for heroic achievement in Belgium on December 26, 1944.

Young Lilly was serving with Co. C, 318th infantry when he assumed command of his company after all the officers had become casualties. He continued the attack to a successful conclusion.

Lilly was born in Klamath Falls September 17, 1923, attended his first year of school at Mills and then transferred to Bonanza where he went through the second year of high school, graduating from Ashland high school in 1941. He attended Southern Oregon College of Education until his entrance into the armed forces. The infantryman's mother is also a native of Klamath Falls as is Lilly's sister, Virginia.
