AND OFTEN, giving them no time to get their second wind.

**EUROPE** these days is a hotbed of suspicion.

What is happening in Flensburg, on the German-Dane border, where Admiral Doenitz still maintains some sort of German government and appears to be still doing some sort of dicker-ing, is arousing heated curiosity. It is a hush-hush mystery, with everybody in authority refusing to talk.

**THE** subject of the war criminals and what is to be done about them is stirring bile and bad blood. The Russians, whose obvious policy (for reasons not known outside the inner circle) is to keep prodding us and the British are beginning to make nasty cracks about it.

A Prof. Anton Trainin, who is a columnist for the Russian army newspaper, Red Star, says today: "The allied war crimes commission in London (on which Russia is NOT represented) has spent many months compiling seven lists of war criminals. Naturally the question that now arises is how much time is going to be required to get these criminals from the lists to the courts?"

He adds: "Justice is in fact moving WITH ITS BRAKES ON."

(THE seven lists include one OF JAPS ONLY. Trainin mentions this and WITHOUT EXCLUDING the Jap list calls for SPEEDY trial for ALL of them.)

WE'VE evidently got a straight tip that Himmler is in the Berchtesgaden area (maybe Ribbentrop and Ley also) and a big manhunt is on there. An encouraging note is lent by the fact that anti-nazi Germans and Austrians are helping us. That seems to indicate that there are SOME anti-nazis. If there were none, we'd face a hard job in rebuilding Germany.
