YOUR GARDEN

Talking about irrigation when it is raining like it has been seems rather foolish, but there are a number of methods of irrigating gardens that it is hoped that you folks will be interested in when the weather is such that your garden will need irrigating. Irrigation water to home gardens may be applied in one or several ways. Sprinkling is probably more in use than any other method because it is easier to apply water in this way but it is not always the best method. Others may have their garden soils graded so that shallow irrigation fills may be made alongside the rows and the water runs down the irrigation rills. Still others use the so-called soil soaker or porous canvas hose, which allows the water to ooze out and soak into the soil. This soil soaker has many advantages if it is watched and moved to another location when the soil becomes wet to a depth of six inches or a little more. One advantage is that you get uniform distribution of the water along the rows and no washing of the soil.

also be used to advantage when irrigating the garden through rows by letting the water strike the sack as it comes from the hose. This will prevent washing of the soil where the water strikes the ground. It takes approximately two-thirds of a gallon of water to each square foot of garden every time the garden is watered.

Gardeners who use sprinklers sometimes set a straight-sided pan under the sprinkler and when the pan gets filled up with one inch or a little more of water it is considered enough water on that area for that particular irrigation. Such an irrigation should last approximately one week for the majority of garden crops, that is, a thorough wetting once a week is sufficient.

I would like to thank those few people who have sent questions and comments to me to be used in this column and also welcome others to send in their comments.

Mrs. Myrtle E. Pfefferle, of 1561 Gary, has sent a question to this column which I will attempt to answer. Generally speaking, in most of the areas around Klamath Falls it is safe to set out tomato plants about the first of June, provided they are kept under hot caps or protected from frost in some other way until about the 15th of June.

Now I have a question: What do you people think about pruning tomato plants, or pulling off the first blossoms? How deep should tomato plants be transplanted?

PROCESSED FOODS:
BLUE STAMPS—Ration book 4—Stamps M-1 through M-2 valid through June 2. Stamps N-1 through N-2 valid through June 30. Stamps T-1 through T-2 valid through July 31. Stamps Y-1, Y-2, A-1, B-1 and C-1 valid May 1 through August 31.

RED STAMPS—Ration book 4—Stamps V-1 through V-2 valid through June 2. Stamps W-1 through W-2 valid through June 30. Stamps K-1 through K-2 valid through July 31. Stamps Q-1, Q-2, R-1, R-2, R-3 and U-1 valid May 1 through August 31.

SUGAR—Ration book 4—Stamp 30 valid through June 2. Stamp 26 valid May 1 through August 31.

SHOES—Ration book 3—Airplane stamps 1 and 2 now valid. New shoe stamp to become valid August 1. Loose stamps invalid.

GASOLINE—Period 1-5 coupons valid through August 31.

PRICE CONTROL—Better inquiries and complaints to price clerk at local board.

RENT CONTROL—In areas under Federal rent control, all rented dwellings units must be registered, and changes in tenancy reported.
