

Georgious Slugs Win Over Achiu; Crowd Boos Tactics

Georgious George Wagner led his way to a gruesome out of three fall win over Chinese sleeper-artist Achiu in the main event at the armory last night, won no personal acclaim for himself for the crowd was disgusted with his killer tactics. Wagner protested the fall, saying his shoulders were not down. Wally Moss, referee, stood firm on his decision, however, and the fall stood. Wagner in anger told Wally to get out of the ring and let him fight, when Wally refused this request to vacate, Wagner came back viciously to slug, smother, and pull the hair of Achiu both in and out of the ring until the Chinaman was out on his feet. Wagner took the fall in the fifth round while the sleeper-artist lay supinely on the mat. The aroused crowd gathered around the ring to heckle and boo the winner for his viciousness, but the wrestlers struggled to the dressing-room without incident. In the semi-windup, Kenny Ackles, the Hollywood wonder boy, drew with his opponent, Paavo Katonen, after pulling certain defeat out of the bag in the last round with a surprise grapevine. Katonen won the first fall in the third round of what was a slow, but clean match. Antone Leone dropped Sailor Hogan in the first bout for two falls in a row. The first fall was taken on a Boston crab hold which weakened the sailor's back. In the second fall Leone worked on the back with his arm and flat until Hogan was near collapse and was awarded the fall. Chief tactic of Leone was poking his opponent in the eye with his thumb.

Ducks Drop As Rainiers Near Top

Seattle's baseball machine, disregarding all speed rules in its race toward the top of the Pacific Coast, had rolled directly behind the stalled Portland Beavers today as only a game separated the two teams. Portland, whose gears slipped into reverse a week ago, dropped its third straight last night to San Francisco in 13 innings for the Beavers' seventh loss in eight games, while the Rainiers were taking their fourth in a row from Los Angeles. Almost as startling as the league leader's decline is the sudden resurgence of the tail-end Hollywood Stars, who equalled their longest winning streak of the season in copping their third in succession from Sacramento. Oakland continued its steady pace against San Diego, making it three out of four.

Giants Still Riding High, Hitting Hard
Scoffers Turn To Admirers As "Murderers' Row" Bats Five Home Runs On Tour

The New York Giants couldn't take the Polo Grounds with them on their first western tour but they're still hitting home runs and riding high today, 17 games over the 50 mark with a six and a half game lead on the field. Scoffers said the Giant's Murderers' Row would turn into an array of pop fly hitters when they left the friendly foul lines of the home field but they have hit five in four western games. Big Ernie Lombardi, enjoying an amazing comeback, has a socked three into the stands since the club left Manhattan and has taken over undisputed lead of both majors with 10 round trippers. Danny Gardella and Phil Weintraub contributed the others. Lombardi banged No. 10 yesterday to help Harry Feldman earn his fifth decision at Cincinnati's expense, 5-2. Feldman held the Reds to six hits, one a two-run homer by Gee Walker. Relief pitcher Ken Burkhardt chalked up his fourth straight triumph for the Cardinals in a 9-7 win over Brooklyn. Starters Tom Seaver and Blix Donnelly faded in the first when the Dodgers scored four and the Birds came back with five. Ray Sanders' round tripper with two men on in the fourth was the telling blow off Curt Davis, making his second appearance of the year as a fireman. Whitey Kurowski continued his terrific hitting pace with two hits, taking over the league lead for runs batted in with 30 and keeping his average at a .398 level. Preacher Roe hurled the Pirates to a 5-3 win over Boston. The talented southpaw was the fifth of the last eight Pittsburgh pitchers to go the route, a new high for Frankie Frisch's staff. Hank Wyse allowed only seven safeties and his Chicago Cub mates blasted the Phils for 16 blows to win, 4-3. Stan Hack of the Bruins contributed two triples and a pair of singles. The New York Yankees, beating the Chicago White Sox for the third straight day, moved into the American league lead by a half game. George Stinnett's triple in the eighth sparked a three-run spurt for a 5-4 verdict for Al Gettel over Lefty Frank Papish.
