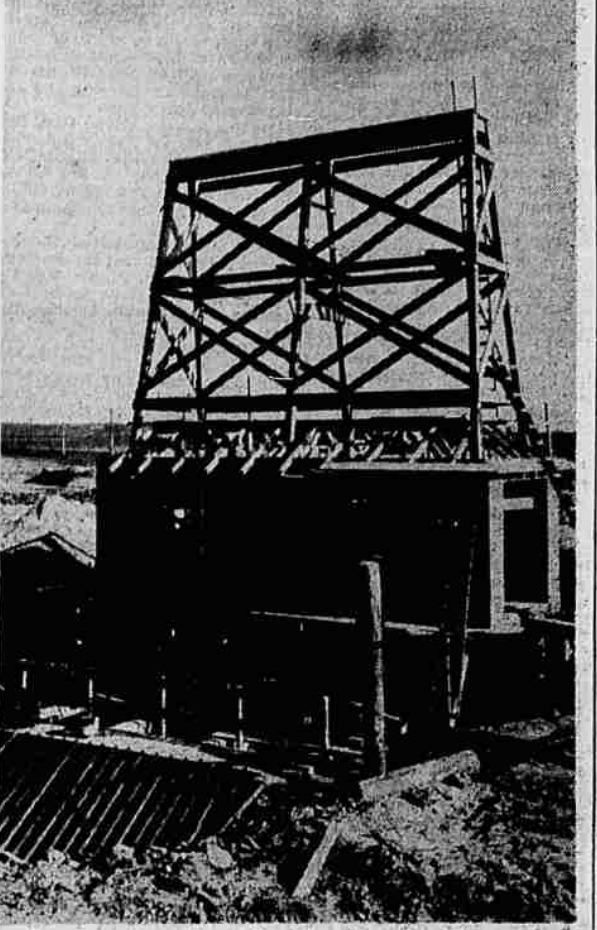
## Spuds Reported Shortage Item

## 7TH BREAKS THROUGH NIP DEFENSE LINE

Possible Cracking Of Nip Troops Shown In Dispatches

On the east flank south of captured Yonabaru the seventh infantry division found what was described as "very large stores" of food, ammunition and equipment in abandoned caves in the Ozato Mura hills.
