

DIER NOTIFIED OF DEATH OF SON

American Red Cross today notified Pvt. Jodie R. Ashford, who is in Italy with the States army, advising of the death of his two-year-old son, Jodie Robert, and the illness of his four-year-old daughter, Wanda. The boy was brought to Klamath Falls hospital at 8:30 a. m. by neighbors of Mrs. Ashford, 2234 White, but on examination by the attending physician the child was found to be on the route to the hospital. The doctor said the boy's illness was attributed to bronchial pneumonia following an attack of measles. The boy's older sister, Wanda, then admitted to Klamath Falls hospital, and her condition was described as critical. Wanda is now receiving medical attention. The family came here 17 days ago from Flagstaff, Ariz. Her remains are at White.

Workers At Alcoa Ready To Return

SEASIDE, Wash., May 28 (AP)—Although 300 strikers who had walked out of the Aluminum Company of America plant four days ago were ready to return to work, company officials said about 50 of the men had called back. The strikers' picket lines, the result of a work stoppage, must be flowing again before full production can be restored. Officials said jack hammers may be used to free the lines. The picket line, kept going by voluntering during the walkout, still is operating. A foreman, over whose man-aging to the men the picket line began, was still on the picket line. August Koch, president of the Aluminum Workers union, said the men voted to return to work as "a patriotic duty."

Mrs. Asa Toothacher, Ontario, died Sunday when the auto driven by Thompson crashed through guard posts at Bend's north city limit and rolled into a dry concrete canal. Thompson and his wife were in a hospital today.

Oregon Second In War Bond Sales

PORTLAND, May 28 (AP)—Oregon ranked second in national E bond sales from May, 1941, through March, 1945, Ted Gamble, director of the treasury war finance division, said here.

Oregon's \$357.28 per capita was only 38 cents below Connecticut's \$357.92 high. Washington, \$7 behind the leader with \$350.80, was third. Gamble stressed need for bond sales despite Germany's surrender. He declared talk of conversion and cutbacks "does not

mean that we do not have a big war on our hands and a big expenditure compared to that of last year."
