

# FATHER SOUGHT IN SLAYING OF DAUGHTER SHOT

KANSAS CITY, May 31 (AP)—Ray E. Davis, 42, sought in the slaying of his 21-year-old daughter, Lula Mae, was found shot to death at his home today.

The girl was shot and killed Tuesday night just after she had greeted a soldier friend who had been overseas for two years.

Davis fled from the home immediately after the shooting. The family and friends received numerous phone calls yesterday and last night from a man purporting to be Davis inquiring about the condition of Lula Mae. She died immediately.

Lt. Charles Welch of the homicide bureau said he and Detective Charles Graham went to the Davis home today on a tip that Davis was there. Graham was stationed at the back door and Welch entered the front door.

Welch gave this account: The police lieutenant heard a shot in the bedroom and he went toward the room. Davis appeared in the doorway and pointed his gun at Welch. Welch fired and Davis fell, dying soon afterward.

It was not determined immediately whether Davis had shot himself or had been killed by the shot fired by Welch.

Members of the Davis family—a frightened mother and two other daughters—spent last night at the city welfare department and were not at home.

Early this morning, police said, Davis called the home of his wife's parents, Mr. and Mrs. William Stepp. A sister-in-law who answered said Davis asked where his wife was, if Lula Mae really was dead and when the funeral would be.

The man sobbed, the sister-in-law said, when she told him the girl was dead, and quoted him as saying he was through causing trouble, that he was going to commit suicide and wanted to be buried with Lula Mae.

# Runaway Travels From Anchorage To Seattle

SEATTLE, May 31 (AP)—Robert Buresh, 12, of Anchorage, Alaska, arrived here by boat from Seward yesterday on what he told members of the Travelers Aid society was a runaway trip from Anchorage to see his father in Los Angeles.

Robert said his father's name was Tex Buresh but the society had been unable to locate him last night.

His mother, he said, is Martha Jean Buresh of Anchorage.

The lad spent \$3.50, almost his entire "capital," for a train ticket to Seward and stowed away on a boat for the rest of the trip here, where he was forced to stop for lack of funds.

# Bombs Break Yukon River Ice Jams

ANCHORAGE, Alaska, May 31 (AP)—A load of 168,000 pounds of bombs dropped by eleventh airforce bombers on ice jams in the Yukon river has unblocked the stream and removed all danger to persons in the flooded Galena region.

Brig. Gen. Dale V. Gaffney of Ladd field, Fairbanks, said damage in the area was held to a minimum due to preparation by army personnel in anticipation of the annual flood.

All persons in the area made their way to safe havens or were flown out by army and navy planes.

# Drag Boat Credited With Record Catch

NEWPORT, Ore., May 31 (AP)—The largest catch of bottom fish ever delivered to a Pacific coast port was credited unofficially today to the drag boat Trask, which docked with 121,120 pounds in her holds and piled on deck.

John Gizdavich, Columbia River Packers association plant superintendent, declared the previous record was 117,000 pounds, claimed by a Seattle ship.

Skipper Ray Douglas said favorable weather, new fishing grounds and use of a fathometer gained the \$500 catch in five days. Owner of the 70-foot Trask is Lloyd Fletcher, Astoria.
