## MOTHER ACCEPTS MEDAL FOR SON

YAKIMA, May 31 (AP)—Mrs. Dora Pendleton of Yakima, yesterday accepted the Congressional Medal of Honor on behalf of her son, Staff Sgt. Jack Pendleton, who was killed in the European action which won him the award.

"With complete humility I clasp this medal around your neck," Lt. Col. Ward W. Roney, acting for Maj. Gen. Joseph D. Patch, commanding general at Fort Lewis, said at Memorial Day ceremonies at Yakima's Tahoma cemetery.

Sgt. Pendleton, Colonel Roney said, led his men against an enemy machine gun commanding a street. He preceded his squad by 10 yards and had advanced 130 yards when he was wounded seriously.

He continued on in a maneuver that enabled a second squad to silence the gun. He was 10 yards from his objective when he was killed.

The citation had been signed by the late President Roosevelt.

## Ideas for Spring Meals

**CREAMED NEW POTATOES AND PEAS**  
Add cooked, peeled, new potatoes and cooked peas to medium thick white sauce, sprinkle with paprika.

**RADISH SLAW**  
Combine thinly sliced, washed radishes with salad dressing, season with salt and pepper, and garnish with parsley.

**ASPARAGUS WITH MOCK HOLLANDAISE SAUCE**  
Beat 1 egg white until stiff but not dry; fold in 1 cup mayonnaise. Pour to 1½-inch thickness in shallow baking dish; place 4 to 5 minutes under very hot broiler until delicately browned, about 1 minute. Makes 1 cup. Serve over asparagus.

**RHUBARB CREAM PIE**  
¾ cup sugar 1 tbsp. grated orange rind  
1 tsp. cinnamon 3 tbsps. cornstarch  
4 tps. salt orange marmalade  
2 cups, cooked rhubarb and juice Baked pastry shell

Combine sugar, cinnamon, cornstarch, and salt; add to rhubarb; and cook about 10 minutes, or until thickened, stirring constantly. Add orange rind and beaten egg yolks; cook 2 minutes longer, stirring constantly. Cool; pour into baked pastry shell. Beat egg whites until stiff and dry; fold in orange marmalade. Pile lightly on pie; bake 15 minutes, or until well browned, in slow oven (300°F.). Makes 19-inch pie. Serves 6.
