

DIVERSION OF KLAMATH EYED BY LEGISLATORS

Diversion of water from the Klamath river to the Sacramento watershed, vigorously opposed by Klamath basin interests, was declared "doubtful feasibility" by a California legislative committee which reported at Sacramento this week.

The special committee on rivers and flood control recommended to the U. S. engineers that they "discontinue investigation of this project." Army engineers held a hearing in Klamath Falls several weeks ago on the proposal.

The California committee, created at the January session, also expressed opposition to a proposal by the United States bureau of reclamation to divert Trinity river water into the Sacramento river watershed.

"The feasibility of the proposed Klamath and Trinity river diversions," the committee reported, "are not directly connected with the proposed water development projects within the central valleys basin, but can only be diverted into that basin at a tremendous cost, a great economic loss, and the upsetting of the natural conditions of a great water system."

Want Full Development

"A full development within the central valleys should precede any diversion of waters from other watersheds to the central valleys."

The committee recommended its continuance to further study river and flood control problems in California.

The report adds: "Uppermost in the minds of the members of this committee is the need for an overall comprehensive plan for water development for the state of California and particularly for the central valleys."

The best needs of the state cannot be served if one particular problem in water development, such as flood control, is allowed to dominate the thinking of persons associated with the development of our water resources.

Points Are Outlined

Far more important, especially to the future generations of this state, is providing solutions for the controversial problems of beneficial use.

These are the issues where the most conflict exists and are, therefore, usually avoided if possible. It is on issues such as these, water for power, irrigation and other beneficial uses, that the future of California depends.

ADOPTION BILL SUPPORTED BY SOCIAL GROUP

SACRAMENTO, Calif., June 7 (AP)—The California department of social welfare is supporting a bill, passed by the assembly, to permit adoption of a married woman's illegitimate child without her husband's consent.

"This bill is not in any sense a measure to protect a chiseling wife," Charles H. Wollenberg, department director, told a senate hearing. "We don't care a whoop about her. The bill was suggested by child placement agencies in this state due to the fact that children of unfaithful wives can't be placed properly when the husbands are in service overseas and can't be reached unless the wives are willing to reveal the overseas addresses."

"We have been having 250 to 300 babies in this classification a year the last two or three years. When the infant can not be placed legally there is a tendency on the part of the faithless wife to abandon the youngster on a door step or place it herself in an indifferent or unsatisfactory home."

"Even if the married mother of an illegitimate child is willing to give the information required for notification of the husband, what is the effect? Let us say he is the commander of 200 men about to go into action, gets his mail just before it starts and in the mail is a citation advising him of adoption proceedings, or a request for a release, what is going to be the effect on his morale and the consequences to the men under him?"

"If the bill were passed the act would not be used where the husband is in the continental United States."

"Nor do we intend to saddle upon the husband of a faithless wife the responsibility for supporting a child which isn't his."

WASHINGTON, June 7 (AP)—The impending conquest of Okinawa winds up, military observers believe, the long, arduous "island hopping" that started with the invasion of Guadalcanal in 1942.

The next American move in the Pacific, in the opinion of these experts, will be the payoff. With the Philippines, the Marianas, Okinawa and Iwo Jima, they say, American forces now have ample bases from which they can mount a major thrust against either China or the Japanese home islands.

Just which way the next blow may fall is up to the enemy to guess. And the jittery Japanese appear to be laying their money on both sides of the line.
