Angels Edge White Sox, Boston Stops Yanks, Browns Defeated

The Cronin's Sox belted the New York Yankees out of the lead and advanced into third place with only two games off the Detroit Tigers with nine wins in their 10 starts.

**Tigers Sneak Up**

Oakland Goes Back To 3rd Place By Virtue of 5-2 Victory Over Sacramento

Portland still had its same 3 1/2-game margin over Seattle today at the top of the Pacific Coast Baseball league, but Oakland was back in third place by virtue of its first victory of the week over Sacramento.

The Beavers had an easy time winning from Los Angeles, Seattle had to go 11 innings before nosing out San Francisco, and Hollywood continued to forge along the comeback trail against San Diego, making it three out of four over the slipping Padres.

**Pulford Notches 10th Win**  
Don Pulford let the Angels down with four hits to chalk up his 10th win of the season for Portland 6-1. The loop-leaders got all their runs in the first four innings off Charley Cuelar.

Seattle's 2-1 decision over San Francisco knocked the Seals out of a fourth place tie into fifth, a half game behind Sacramento. A wild throw to first base by Ray Perry, San Francisco second sacker, allowed Hal Patchett to score the deciding run for Seattle in the first of the eleventh. The game, which knotted the series at two all, was a pitching duel between Carl Fischer of the Rainiers and Bob Barthelsson of the Seals.

**Oaks Trip Solons, 5-2**  
Oakland was aided by four Sacramento errors in winning 5-2. Two of the bobbles came in the first inning when the Acorns got to Pitcher Gene Babbitt for three runs. Don Powers, in relief hurler for the Solons, gave up two more tallies, one in the second and another in the sixth. Sacramento got its brace of runs off Italo Chelini in the third frame, but left runners stranded on the sacks in nearly all other innings.

**Stars Blast Padres**

Bill Kerr of Toronto, in fourth place, was the leading Canadian at the end of the second day, with a total of 141 made up of a 69 and a 72. Stan Horne, Islesmere pro, was fifth with 70 and 72 for 142.
