Australian ninth division moved so rapidly through the warring heat of Borneo's jungles that even the few Japanese defenders were confused.

## Fleets Blast Way

More than 5000 Japanese in the area and they didn't see a single man during the operation Sunday. The seventh fleet and attached Australian naval units had lain in wait for three days, busily preparing the way.

## Emergency Bill

The Japanese diet which had at delegating its powers to a wartime cabinet adopted a bill requiring the cabinet to consult a special parliamentary committee before issuing an edict. The bill also authorized the use of "peoples volunteer corps" to be used in military construction and in the defense of the islands. Broadcasts indicated every man between 15 and 25 would be expected to "volunteer." Ages will be lowered for fighting purposes. Guerrillas are to be armed with grenades and rifles. They will rely on bamboo spears, samurai swords or any available weapon.

## Prisoners Hold Rescue Work

ANILA, June 12 (AP)—Slowly burning and cuts, suffered by an American Wac when a port plane crashed into a plain overlooking the New Guinea island of Shangri-la, delayed rescue operations. An East air force reported the announcement said the survivors of the crash—Cpl. Margaret Hastings of 40, N. Y., Lt. John B. McQuinn of Trenton, Mo., and Kenneth W. Decker, of Wash.—will probably make a 10-mile foot journey in three days from the plain saddle where they were stranded to the valley.

# Churchill Tells Of Negotiations With Vichy

LONDON, June 12 (AP)—Prime Minister Churchill disclosed today that Britain was in secret negotiation with the French Vichy government in 1940, but asserted "Vichy was too much under German duress" to be able to give concrete assurances that the French fleet would not be surrendered to the nazis.

Churchill's disclosure was made in commons, in apparent answer to Marshall Petain's assertion that he was negotiating a secret treaty with Britain during the German occupation of France.

# Truman Urges Pay Increases

WASHINGTON, June 12 (AP)—President Truman formally recommended today an immediate increase of 15 per cent in congressional salaries and an ultimate boost to a minimum of \$15,000 annually when wage controls are removed.

The president wrote Senator McKellar (D-Tenn.), president pro tempore of the senate and Speaker Rayburn of the house suggesting that salaries of both senators and representatives be brought "to a level more in line with the job" they are called upon to perform.
