Vatican Efforts To Keep Italy From War Outlined

VATICAN CITY, June 13 (AP)—The Vatican, in an 18-page pamphlet outlining the Holy See's efforts to keep Italy out of war, disclosed Tuesday that Pope Pius XII personally appealed to Benito Mussolini in a letter April 24, 1940, to "spare our and your beloved country such a great calamity."

The letter was written less than two months before Italy entered the conflict. Mussolini replied six days later, the pamphlet said, with a declaration that "if Italy should take up arms tomorrow it will be as clear as the sun to everyone that honor and interest in the future will absolutely demand her to do it."

The Duce asserted that the history of the church demonstrated it had never accepted a formula of peace "at any cost," of "peace without justice," of peace which might irreparably compromise the destiny of the Italian people.

On May 13, less than a month before Italy declared war, the pamphlet said, Dino Alfieri, newly-named Italian envoy to Berlin, told the pope that Mussolini was "irritated" at the pontiff's telegrams of sympathy to the low country rulers following the German invasion.

Alfieri, who had been Italian ambassador to the Holy See, saw the pope then in a farewell audience.

The pope, the pamphlet said, replied that he merely had done his duty and "we are not even afraid of being sent to a concentration camp."

Other "fervent hints" in favor of peace for Italy were made by the pontiff to King Vittorio Emanuele and the

queen when they visited the Vatican January 21, 1939, and again when the pontiff called on them at the royal palace on January 28, 1939, the pamphlet added.

It declared the pope was particularly interested in keeping Italy out of the war because it was the seat of the Vatican.

"So long as Italy remained at peace," it explained, "the communications of the Catholic world with its center could have, despite war, continued to operate with a certain normalcy."

The pope, it continued, was aware that "an Italy which remained in dignified neutrality could have rendered valuable services to the cause of peace among the peoples."

Mitchell, back from a trip that carried him and other members of the senate war investigating (Mead) committee over most of western Europe, declared today: "I was struck by the dependence of these countries on the United States to open up magic gates and establish an immediate flow of prosperity. I sometimes fear the reaction when it is realized that the job just can't be done by a snap of the fingers."
