

LAB FUNDLESS FOR TWO WEEK PERIOD, REPORT

WASHINGTON, June 14 (AP) — NLRB disclosed today that it had gone before a new appropriation becomes available. It blamed its plight on a long number of strike votes. The Smith-Connelly war in disputes act, requiring that strike vote be taken within 30 days of notice that a dispute has, has dipped deep into the national labor relation board's treasury.

While it is making an emergency appeal to congress for permission to transfer about \$500,000 from its printing and binding account to general expenditures, it has called a halt on investigations and new hearings in the field for 10 days—June 12 to 22.

The mails will be depended entirely for communication with its regional force, the board said.

During March, April and May a total number of workers able to ballot in strike votes was 548,000, which the board estimates at six times the total for the first eight months of the fiscal year.

The sudden upturn in the number of votes began in March, when John L. Lewis' workers were polled and in April when his anthracite workers also had a strike vote.

PARIS, June 14 (AP)— Gen. Eisenhower was made a "Fellow of the Liberation" today by Gen. De Gaulle in an elaborate ceremony before the tomb of France's unknown soldier.

Flanked by high American and British officials the supreme allied commander received the bronze medal with a deep green ribbon from De Gaulle who said: "We recognize you as our companion in the liberation of France and in its honor and in the victory."

Paris was bedecked with allied flags as Eisenhower received a hero's reception in the French capital.
