CARGO SHIP BURNED, BOAT HIT BY BOMBS

AN ALEUTIAN BASE, Alaska, June 12 (Delayed) (P)—One small Japanese cargo ship was left burning fiercely and at least one patrol boat was damaged by army and navy bombers from the western Aleutians in an attack on shipping off the Kurile Islands northeast of Japan yesterday. The crew of the cargo ship was abandoning it as the airmen turned away.
 Harpoon planes from fleet air wing four located the cargo vessel two miles off eastern Paramushiro and after bombing expended 4000 rounds of .50 caliber ammunition in strafing their target in the face of fierce anti-aircraft fire. One Harpoon was damaged but returned to its base without casualties.
 Eleventh airforce Liberators crossed Paramushiro to the Sea of Okhotsk where they located two Japanese patrol boats which were bombed and strafed. One patrol boat was heavily damaged.
 One Liberator was hit by anti-aircraft fire, but it also returned to its base without injuries.
 On the previous day, navy Harpoons located four armed trawlers off eastern Paramushiro after bombing and strafing left at least one burning. Eleventh airforce Liberators and Mitchells the same day struck installations at Inchinowatari on Arado Island in the Okhotsk sea, the Asahigawa and Kurabu airfields on Paramushiro, and Otimari cove on Oknekotan Island in the central Kuriles.
 Mitchells making the Arado attack were intercepted by eight Japanese fighters, of which two were probably shot down.

 A front porch at 339 Iowa, \$200, Mrs. Leo Lehto; remodeling at 1230 Owens, \$1000, by Angelo Doveri; remodeling a store front at 937 Main, \$3000, by Cecil Green.

Medal Of Honor Men Receive Discharges
FORT LEWIS, June 14 (P)—Two Pacific Northwest soldiers, both holders of the Congressional Medal of Honor, were headed home today—well earned discharges in their pockets.
 They are T/S Robert D. Maxwell, Creswell, Ore., and Sgt. Leo J. Powers, Alder, Montana. The former, a 24-year-old Oregon lumberjack who holds, in addition to the nation's highest award, the Silver Star and Purple Heart with a Bronze Oakleaf Cluster, said he plans to return and "take care of my 78-year-old invalid grandmother who adopted me when I lost my parents."
 Maxwell earned the Congressional Medal when he hurled himself upon a German hand grenade to stifle the explosion and thereby saved lives of his comrades. He was permanently injured in his action.

Taylor Predicts CVA Passage In Congress
BOISE, Idaho, June 14 (P)—Declaring his endorsement of a Columbia valley authority has "received a favorable reception," Sen. Glen H. Taylor (D-Idaho) predicted yesterday that the measure will obtain congressional approval.
 "There are so many senators from states surrounding the Tennessee valley authority who favor such authorities," he explained, "and they will vote for a CVA."
 The measure was introduced by Sen. Mitchell (D-Wash.).

NEW RECORD
PORTLAND, June 14 (P)—A three-week period without any new cases of spinal meningitis is Oregon's longest on record since August, 1942, State Health Officer Harold M. Erickson said today.
 However, five cases of diphtheria, all in Multnomah county, ranked high for eight weeks.
