

STREAMS GOOD FOR FISHING, SAYS BULLETIN

PORTLAND, June 15 (AP)—Fishing streams throughout Oregon are improved this week and a river and lake catches are reported fair to good by the game commission's weekly bulletin.

Willamette valley streams are generally good, and all Lane county lakes except Gold lake are very good. In Marion county, trout and bass are taken on the creek and Santiam river; the Klamath river is good for flies.

Coastal streams are low and clear and fly fishing is good in both Coos and Curry counties. Salmon fishing in the river is poor but trout are taken on flies. Elk and chuck river are the best this week, the commission reports.

Western Oregon streams continue to be good and bag limits reported in scattered counties.

Masses are rising to plugs cast on shore at Dog lake while elsewhere — at Silver Lake, Warner valley, Upper Sprague and Deep creek — is only fair.

In the Klamath area plugs and lures are being used in the main river. Lake of the Umpqua is good for trolling and Little Deschutes is good for trout and egg bait. North and south forks of the Sprague are also good.

All Malheur streams are clear and conditions depend on the weather the next few days. Willamette streams are good for trout with spinners, bait and fly tackle flies with good catches. Fly fishing continues excellent in Lower Deschutes and Warm Springs and Crooked river vicinity. Jackson county streams are normal and good trout catches are reported.

WORKERS OUT ON SYMPATHY STRIKE

SEATTLE, June 15 (AP)—Protesting what they termed a "lockout" of members the management had suspended for quitting early, 3500 employees of the Lake Washington shipyards here walked out yesterday in sympathy with 170 AFL machinists who precipitated the action.

A memorandum had been issued by the navy earlier asking the management to correct immediately what it termed "startling" condition of loafing on the job.

The management did not comment on either the walkout

or the memorandum but said a statement may be issued today.

Ten machinists were suspended last week for leaving their jobs before the whistle sounded and 170 machinists walked out for three days. Today's stoppage began before the end of the day shift and became general by the time the swing shift started.
