OPA CHARGES VIOLATION OF RATION RULES

Two local service stations and two taxicab companies have been charged with the violation of gasoline rationing by Sol Stern, enforcement attorney of the Portland district OPA office.

Those involved are John Fanning of the Richfield service station located at 1102 East Main. Fanning was charged with an unexplained inventory shortage on the sale of gasoline without coupons.

Ray J. Smith, employe of Fanning's, was charged with selling gasoline without coupons under instructions of his employer.

Wiley Knighten, owner of the Pine Street Service station at 7th and Pine, was also charged with an unexplained inventory shortage of gasoline.

The Hurray Cab company under the ownership of Knighten was given a 90-day probationary suspension for having overdrawn its ration bank account 1000 gallons.

135 Employment Vacancies Listed

There are 135 employment vacancies at the naval air station which must be filled immediately, Civil Service Agent Eugene Liljenquist stated today.

The salary for guards and fire fighters is \$180 per month. Fire fighters work 24-hour shifts, 24 on and 24 off, making it easy to attend small business and farms between hours of duty.

Persons interested in any of the above positions may contact Jack Almeter at the United States employment office, having overdrawn its ration bank account 344 gallons.

Announcing A New Price Schedule To Bring More Slabwood To Klamath

The OPA has put into effect the following increased price schedules for slabwood to make up for part of the acute shortage of fuel in Klamath:

Table with price schedules for various sizes of slabwood: 16 in. green pine slabs, local \$5.50; 16 in. dry pine slabs, local 8.50; 12 in. green fir slabs, imported 8.00; 12 in. dry fir slabs, imported 11.00.

These prices apply to the City of Klamath Falls area. The usual differentials apply to deliveries outside the Klamath Falls area.

The price increase to the customer, which is supplemented by government subsidy, will be used to: 1. Salvage more local wood than was possible under the previous price structure, and 2. Bring in wood from distant communities.

Dealers hope that this measure will provide a good deal of the fuel needed here, and believe that shortages will not work too great hardships if consumers will convert to coal and Pre-to-logs as much as possible and lay in supplies of both of these fuels NOW!

Dealers have storage for only 10% of the coal needed here annually... so it is imperative to build up your own supplies during the hot summer months. Any available DRY storage space should be filled with Pre-to-logs now, while supplies are available!
