

COMPANY WINS UNIT BRAVERY CITATION

U. S. TENTH ARMY HEADQUARTERS, Okinawa, June 25 (AP)—A presidential citation for bravery in the Okinawa campaign was received today for company L of the 383rd regiment, 98th division, which prepared for battle in Oregon.

The citation was for the company's capture of a Japanese strong point at Kakazu village April 9.

The company charged with fixed bayonets and in hand-to-hand fighting won a ridge and held it all day. The Americans had to withdraw at night because their flanks were vulnerable.

The company killed 180 Japanese, including several high officers, and destroyed Japanese forces that had been raking Yank positions from the flank. Capture of the strong point permitted the entire command to advance.

Less Meat This Week, Says Dealer Official

WEATHER DELAYS RESCUE EFFORTS

HOLLANDIA, Dutch New Guinea, June 23 (Delayed) (AP)—Ugly flying weather is delaying low-plane rescue efforts of 14 men and a girl from hidden Shangri-la valley in the New Guinea mountain wilds.

WAC Cpl. Margaret Hastings of Owego, N. Y., Sgt. Kenneth Decker of Kelso, Wash., and Lt. John B. McCollom of Trenton, Mo., have been marooned in New Guinea's mountain fastness since May 13 when their sight-seeing plane crashed killing 20. The 12 others are parachuted rescue workers.

The experimental glider plane, to be used in the rescue work, is grounded at Wakde island, Dutch New Guinea, by zero weather.
