

WASTE PAPER, CAN SALVAGE DRIVE SLATED

A statewide drive to collect critically-needed waste paper and tin cans for the war effort will be the Shriners' hospital in Portland suggested as the beneficiary of funds raised was announced by Claude I. Sersanos, chairman of Oregon's state salvage committee.

The drive, which will be held from July 21 to July 29, is made necessary by the continued critical need for paper and tin at a time when schools and youth groups largely are on vacation. It will be "keyed" through Oregon's volunteer salvage committees, together with all Oregon Shrine clubs, county courts, civilian defense council personnel, and heads of numerous other civic and fraternal organizations.

Governor Earl Snell, who has accepted a state salvage committee invitation to be honorary drive chairman, issued the following statement:

"The salvage of waste paper and tin has been declared by the war production board as a continuing vital necessity if our war production plants are to operate at capacity. The two-fold purpose of this drive—to aid our boys 'over there' and help crippled youngsters here at home—is worthy of the support of all Oregon citizens."

Sersanos and Ethel Keck, chairman of women's activities for the state salvage committee, are serving as general drive chairman and a state executive committee has been set up to execute the program. Representing Klamath Falls on this committee is Frank Jenkins, editor of The Herald and News.

CAUTION IN WOODS URGED BY KOG HEAD

Fourth of July vacationers, expected to use the forest areas of Oregon in large numbers next week, will enter forest lands when the red warning flag of fire is flying, according to Walter Wiesendanger, chairman of the Klamath county Keep Oregon Green association. Heat of the past few days has dried out the grass and fuel in timber areas to create a real fire hazard, the KOG county chairman pointed out.

"I join with Governor Snell, State Forester Rogers and Keep Oregon Green officials in urging the public to use extreme caution while in the woods this year," he said. "Many people will be enjoying the great outdoors on camping and picnicking trips who haven't been in the woods since the war. These people may forget what one careless match will do, or how much pure deviltry one unguarded or improperly put out camp fire can cause."

Fire Destroys Two School Buildings

SEATTLE, June 27 (AP)—Damage estimated at \$20,000 was caused last night when fire destroyed two large buildings of the Briscoe Memorial school for boys, south of Seattle.

The fire, of unknown origin, started in the laundry, in a building which also houses a garage and modern cannery. Flames spread to the gymnasium, one of the best equipped in this area.

Brother J. X. Dunphy, school superior for the Catholic institution, said the boys remained in the dormitory while 14 of the brothers helped fight the fire. Though the school has an enrollment of 165, most of the boys were away for summer vacation, he said.

Socialite Awarded \$1,650,000 Estate

LOS ANGELES, June 27 (AP)—A property settlement awarding Mrs. Dorothy M. Fleet, 36-year-old Beverly Hills socialite, a \$1,650,000 estate has been filed in court in connection with her divorce action against Reuben H. Fleet, former president of Consolidated Aircraft company.

The large settlement gives Mrs. Fleet \$171,500 in cash, a \$110,000 home in Beverly Hills, a \$90,000 home in Palm Springs, Calif., and \$1,250,000 trust fund with an annual income of \$45,000.

Mrs. Fleet dropped her original demand for \$10,000,000 under the agreement she is given custody of their three children. She is seeking a divorce on allegations of cruelty.

SHERMAN COUNTY FARMS DECREASE

The number of farms in Sherman county, as shown by the preliminary count of returns of the 1945 census of agriculture was 292, as compared with 343 in 1940, and 367 in 1935. This was announced today by R. L. Ackerman, supervisor for the 1945 farm census in the third Oregon census district with headquarters at Klamath Falls.

The total land in farm, according to the count, was 471,175 acres, as compared with 462,375 acres in 1940, and 438,220 acres in 1935. Average size of farms shown in the preliminary 1945 census count for Sherman county was 1614 acres, as compared with 1348 acres in 1940, and 1194 acres in 1935.

Lodges, Lake Resorts Now Open To Local Vacationers

A large number of lodges and lake resorts are now open to residents of the Klamath Falls area. Owners and proprietors of these various resort spots anticipate a large influx of persons seeking relaxation and pleasure.

Diamond lake resort, managed by George L. Howard, is again operating on a small scale this year. Housekeeping cottages are available but no bedding or linen is furnished. Rates run from \$2.50 to \$11 per day. A few sleeping cottages and hotel rooms are open which furnish bedding and linen and the rates for these are from \$5 single to \$7 per day.

The coffee shop is open this year to accommodate persons occupying cottages. Boats are rented for \$3 per day, but no outboard motors are available and persons desiring to furnish gasoline for their own motors must have E. coupons. Diamond lake is located 87 miles northwest of Klamath Falls.

Lake o' the Woods, another popular resort, is managed by Mr. and Mrs. Dutcher. This beautiful lake is located 37 miles northwest of Klamath Falls.

Cres-Del lodge on the Willamette highway is owned and managed by Mr. and Mrs. Wardell. It is open the year around. Harry T. Mooney operates the Crescent lake lodge which is 104 miles northwest of here.

East lake resort is 128 miles

north and is managed by Mrs. George W. McCormack, while Elk lake lodge is operated by Myrtle Simmons and is located 131 miles north of this city.

Fish lake resort is managed by Hugh Rankin, PO box 897, Medford. It is 47 miles northwest of here.

Harriman lodge lies 29 miles north of here and is managed by Mr. and Mrs. Gus Johnson, 759 California, while Odell lodge is operated by Ross W. Finley and is 104 miles northwest of Klamath Falls.

Paulina lake fishing lodge is under the supervision of Ray H. Reed and Son, La Pine, Oregon, and Summit lodge is owned and operated by Mr. and Mrs. Lowell Hall. Suttle lake lodge is 179 miles due north and is operated by George H. Prince.

Located on the upper Willamette river, 139 miles from Klamath Falls is the Kilton hot mineral springs resort. A special feature of this resort are the hot mineral springs located there. This resort is managed by W. H. Cash. Rates for the lodge, including room and meals, are \$25 a week, cabins are \$4 a week.
