## STAMPS VALIDATED FOR RATIONED FOOD

Five more blue stamps for processed foods and five more red stamps for meats-fats, all in war ration book four, will be good on Sunday, July 1, the office of price administration said today.

Each of the stamps will be worth 10 points, making a total of 50 blue points for processed foods and 50 red points for

meats-fats. All stamps that become good on July 1 can be used through October 31.

The new stamps are:

Blue, for processed foods—J1, K1, L1, M1, and N1.

Red, for meats-fats—A1, B1, C1, D1 and E1.
