

POTATO MEN LAUD STATE TEST PLOTS

State plots for testing certified potato seed samples in advance of the main planting season have a real value to the industry, it was agreed by Oregon producers and specialists viewing this year's project at the OSC experiment station.

Scott Warren, Karl Dillinger, Bob Cheyne, Jerry Short, Gib Osborne, Vernon Durante and Bob McCambridge of Klamath basin attended the meeting in Corvallis.

This joint undertaking by the extension service and experiment station is an extra check on the California results, and gives local growers and field inspectors advance warning as to what diseases to rogue for during the season. Disease readings on the state plot confirmed in most instances earlier findings in California, it was noted.

The test field this year contained 168 samples of eight varieties grown in 12 counties. Some 38 Oregon growers viewed the plots at a field day after official accounts of diseased plants had been made. Later the plots were studied by certification specialists from seven western states and British Columbia, who took part in the three-day conference on certification plans and practices.

Delegates to the conference made progress toward unification and standardization practices throughout the west, not only of potato seed, but all other certified seed as well. The object is to develop uniform grades so that a grade tag from any state will mean the same as any other.

Farmers To Apply For Farm Trucks, Gas, To OPA, ODT

After Saturday, June 30, Klamath county farmers and ranchers will apply directly to ODT and OPA for new farm trucks and for farm gasoline. Burrell Short, chairman of the county AAA committee, reminded today.

On that date, AAA servicing of farm transportation programs by committees will cease, the chairman said, as it will have neither funds nor authority to continue services.

Short said that processing will be completed for applications on file, but that no new applications can be accepted after June 30. He advised farmers to contact their local OPA war price and rationing board for tires and gasoline, and the district ODT office in Portland for trucks.

Increase in Dairy Payments Slated

Dairy farmers in Klamath county will receive increased dairy production payments beginning July 1, when the summer schedule of rates becomes effective. These government payments, designed to encourage production of milk and butterfat, are adjudged quarterly.

The new rates for this county for production in July, August and September will be 55 cents per hundredweight for milk, and 13 cents a pound for butterfat, according to B. W. Short, county AAA committeeman. Present rates are 35 cents for milk, and 10 cents for butterfat.

YOUR GARDEN

When transplanting tomato plants give the roots room. Make the hole to receive the plant larger than the ball of earth, or the box, or other container in which it is grown. This allows room for the roots without crowding. Set plants one to three inches deeper than they grew in pots, boxes or flats.

Tomato growers are generally agreed that a liquid fertilizer should be used as a "starter" or "booster" when the plants are set out. One ounce of victory garden fertilizer or similar mix is used in one gallon of water. One pint to one quart of the liquid fertilizer is poured about the plant at planting time. Keep the mixture agitated while applying.

One authority pointed out that when tomato plants are set in the soil with the paper pots still attached, that a liquid fertilizer should be used to supply extra nitrogen, since the decomposing paper pots steal nitrogen from the plants.

Handle tomato plants carefully at transplanting time. Keep the soil attached to the roots, and do not expose roots to the sun.

Pruning Pointer

Pruning of tomato plants is not necessary even when tomatoes are staked. There is much argument over this point. In the case of staked tomatoes all parts and branches of the tomato plant may be loosely tied to

the stakes. Make sure the ties do not slip down on the stakes. Mulching tomato plants with lawn clippings, rotting leaves, or straw does much to keep an even supply of moisture and to prevent blossom and rot. The mulch must be deep enough to be effective.

The control of the disease called tomato mosaic must be based on the protection of the seedlings from infection, since there is no remedy for infected

plants. Workers should not smoke or chew tobacco while handling seedlings. Tobacco users should wash their hands before they touch the plants.

Tomato mosaic virus is the same as that of ordinary tobacco mosaic. The virus remains active in dried tobacco leaves for a long time and is present to some extent in cigar, cigarette and pipe tobacco.
