

# GREAT DEMAND FOR HOUSING CONTINUES

Small furnished houses and apartments are still in great demand, according to the chamber of commerce which receives a number of calls each day from servicemen and civilians. The demand for rooms is not as great as it has been as people seem to be looking for something larger where there are cooking facilities.

According to Charles A. Hayden of the federal public housing authority, the civilian housing project of 50 homes has not been progressing very fast. Instead of being completed this month as expected, Hayden said that it may be a month or more before they will be ready. The houses for military personnel will probably be ready by the first of September as called for in the building contract. Most of the lawns have been planted and the streets paved.

At present there are from 10 to 20 families on the waiting list, although the housing authority attempts to limit this because they try to fill a vacant house with a family which has been living in the trailer section. Applications for the military group must be certified by the base where the man is stationed.

SAN FRANCISCO, July 6 (AP)—Mah Jung Don, 25-year-old resident of San Francisco's Chinatown, is white, has always thought he was Chinese, and now doesn't know what nationality he prefers.

Details of his predicament came out in superior court yesterday when he appeared on a charge of stealing some gold coins and watches from the room of a Chinese.

Police Sgt. Jack Manion of the Chinatown squad reported a routine check of immigration files disclosed Jung was born in Sacramento to white parents, but when he was a year old he was adopted by a Chinese couple and taken to Hong Kong where he was reared as their child. He returned to this country in 1941 and has worked as a bus boy in several restaurants here.

"Yes, American," he replied. "You rather be China boy?" Murphy then queried.
