Churchill Leaves For Southern France

LONDON, July 7 (AP)—The British government announced today that Prime Minister Churchill, accompanied by Mrs. Churchill, departed today for southern France where he hopes to have a few days rest before attending the Berlin conference.

The last six weeks have been strenuous for the prime minister. He conducted a bitter election campaign and attended to many of the duties of Foreign Secretary Anthony Eden, who is ailing.

The announcement from 10 Downing street said the French government had been consulted on the visit which "is purely of private character."

ANTHONY EDEN'S SON SAID MISSING

LONDON, July 7 (AP)—Sgt. Simon Eden, eldest son of Foreign Secretary Anthony Eden, was reported missing today on an operational flight in Burma.

The air ministry said the British aircraft on which he was flying as a crew member has been unreported for several days.

The searching planes sighted five crewmen of a missing Canadian air force plane. The men were rescued from rubber boats and returned to their Newfoundland base.

3000 JAP-YANKS ON CASUALTY LIST

SAN FRANCISCO, July 7 (AP)—Casualties among the 20,529 Japanese-Americans in the nation's armed forces are estimated by the war relocation authority at 3000. R. C. Cozzen, assistant director of the WRA, reported today.

Cozzen also made public a letter from Gen. Jacob L. Devers, head of all U. S. ground forces, in which he said the Nisei under his command "are, in my opinion, among the finest soldiers in the United States army."

The letter was sent to the Friends of the American Way, Pasadena, an organization combating terrorism against Japanese-Americans in California.

"It is my fervent wish," the general wrote, "that America never forget the struggles and sacrifices of its fighting men—including these Nisei, who, like the rest, have fought so courageously for our democratic ways of life."
