

## EVACUEE CANTEENS OPEN AFTER THEFT

NEWELL, July 9 — Canteens of the Tule Lake Cooperative Enterprises, Inc., operated under evacuee management at WRA's Tulelake center here, were reopened today after having been closed five days during investigation of the loss of \$3359.25 from the business office safe.

The missing money was not part of cooperative funds but had been left in the business office for safe keeping by customers.

The closing had been ordered by the evacuee board of directors in hopes it would speed solution of the case. No arrests have been made as yet and investigation is continuing.

## Douglas Truckers Halt Operations

ROSEBURG, Ore., July 9 (AP) — Falling to secure action on their demand for improvement of the North Umpqua roads, the Douglas County Log Truckers association today ceased all hauling over the route. Out of 41 logging and piling trucks originally operating, only 11 were in operating condition, the association reported, and these were brought to Roseburg today and lined up in front of the county courthouse for inspection by the county court.

Hauling will not be resumed, the operators declared, until improvements are made to halt excessive damage to equipment.

## Woman Injured In Accident Fatal To Portland Physician

PORTLAND, July 9 (AP) — Mrs. Allen E. Kidd, 69, was in a hospital today being treated for severe shock after an auto accident which was fatal to her husband, a physician and surgeon here.

Dr. Kidd, 69, drowned late Saturday when their car plunged off the Columbia river highway at the Troutdale bridge into the Sandy river. He was able to get out of the car, witnesses said, but succumbed before rescuers could reach him.

Harry C. Pennell, 55, who has a lodge near the bridge, rowed across the river to save Mrs. Kidd.

The couple was returning from a trip to the Columbia Gorge hotel when the auto missed a turn and crashed down a 70-foot bank.

## X-RAY SURVEY UNIT TO ARRIVE JULY 27

The new mobile chest X-ray survey unit, built and equipped with Christmas seal funds, will arrive in Klamath county on July 27 for about 10 days.

The X-ray service is free to the public and is paid for by the Oregon Tuberculosis association and the county public health associations from the seal funds.

Definite days for each community will be set as soon as enrollments come in. Any individual or organization interested in enrolling should contact the executive secretary, Izola J. Parker, at PO Box 940 or Vance Vaupel at Currius for Drugs. Blanks may also be secured from the chamber of commerce.

The first stop will be made at the Crang mills at Bly where arrangements have already been made to survey the men at the mill. In Klamath county stops will be made in Klamath Falls, Malin, Chiloquin, Glichrist and Shevlin.

The purpose of the unit is to get all of the apparently well population to take advantage of the free service to make sure they do not have tuberculosis.

## Two Months' Lumber For Army Revealed

PORTLAND, Ore., July 9 (AP) — Lumber operators were warned today inventories of available lumber reveal only two months' supply for the armed forces, which have ordered 800 million board feet from Douglas fir mills.

Comdr. W. W. Kellogg, navy lumber coordinator, said military strategy is based on 90 to 120 day production schedules and lumber delivery must be prompt.

He disclosed stocks of some grades of lumber would last only 14 days.

"The war with Japan will require more lumber than the war in Europe, because no production facilities are available in the islands," he said.

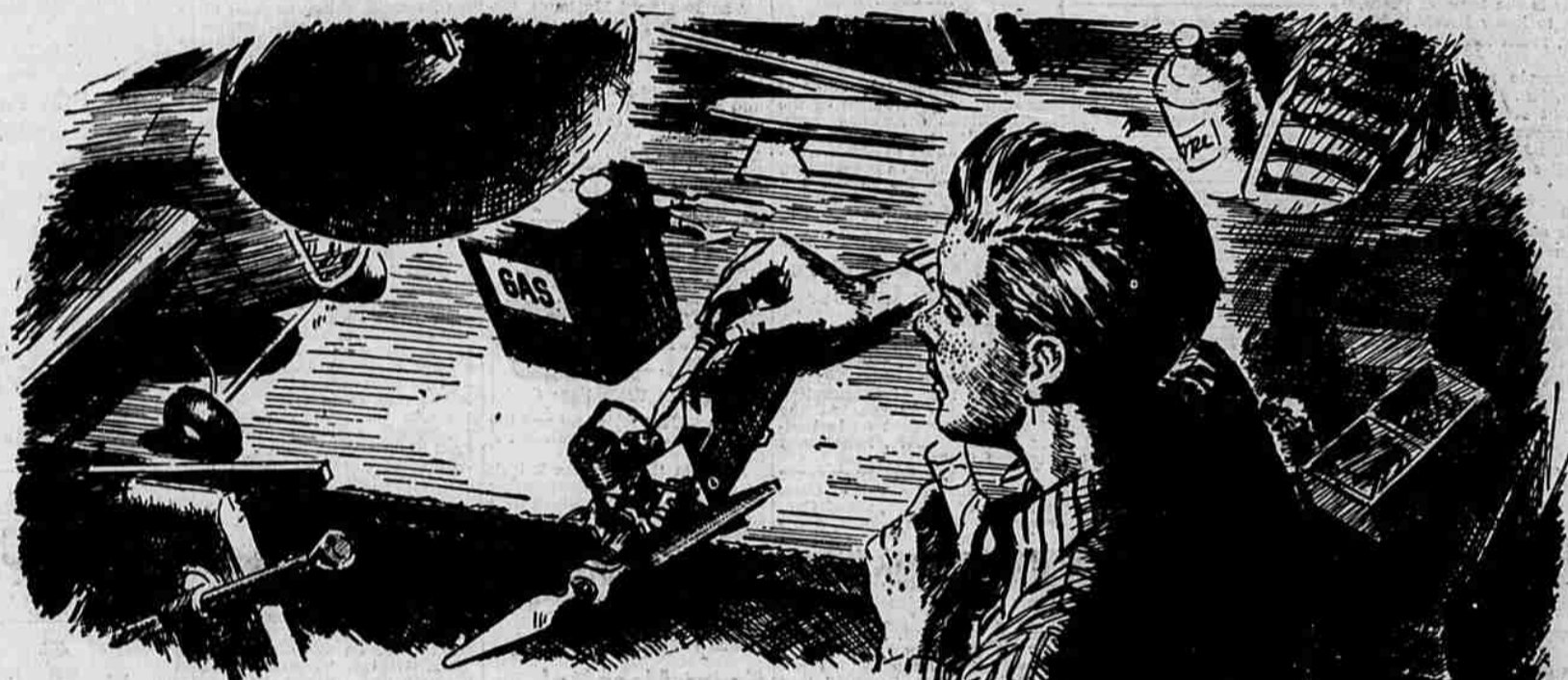
