PROCESSED FOODS

BLUE STAMPS—Ration book 4—Stamps T-2 through X-3 valid through July 31. Stamps Y-2 through C-1 valid through August 31. Stamps D-1 through H-1 valid through September 30. Stamps A-1 through N-1 valid through October 31.

RED STAMPS—Ration book 4—Stamps K-2 through P-2 valid through July 31. Stamps Q-2 through S-2 valid through August 31. Stamps V-2 through Z-2 valid through September 30. Stamps A-1 through E-1 valid through October 31.

SUGAR—Book 4—Sugar stamp 36 valid through August 31. Endorsed rationing sugar coupons with Ration Book 4 number and your name.

SHOES—Book 2—Airplane stamps 1-2-3 now valid. A new shoe stamp will be valid August 1. "Old lot" shoes ration-free July 2 through July 23.

LIQUOR—Book 1—Old lot shoes ration-free July 2 through July 23.

GASOLINE—A-1 10 coupons, 6 gallons each, valid through September 21. B-1 10 coupons, 6 gallons each, valid through October 21.

FUEL OIL—1944-1945 period 1-2-3-4 and 5 coupons expire August 31, 1945. 6th period 1 coupons expire August 31, 1945.

PRICE CONTROL—Refer inquiries to Bureau of Price Control, 430 Main.

RENT CONTROL—In areas under federal rent control, all rented dwellings must be registered, and changes in tenancy reported.
