## BRATTON PACK STILL WORKING DESPITE FIRE

Slaughtering and curing operations have continued at the Bratton packing plant on the Keno road without delay, in spite of fire destruction July 2, George Bratton, manager, said today.

Although freezing compressors were destroyed and the temperature in the locker rooms reached 16 above zero the day after the fire, 1000 pounds of dry ice brought by truck immediately from Ashland relieved the situation.

Bratton attributed the success of keeping the locker rooms below freezing temperature to dry ice and a 12-inch thickness of rock wool insulation.

The dry ice lasted well the six-day period without the compressor unit. Temperature reached 24 degrees above zero as the highest during that time.

A new compressor arrived July 4 and installing operations were completed Sunday when temperature in the freezing rooms was again reduced to zero. Food stored in the lockers suffered no damage during the delay.

Charred debris is being cleared away now in preparation for constructing a new packing unit, to replace the building which was destroyed. Work on the new section will start soon, Bratton said.

## British Columbia Loggers On Holiday

VANCOUVER, B. C., July 11 (AP)—Approximately 8000 Vancouver Island loggers began an enforced and indefinite holiday yesterday as lumber camps suspended operations by order of the British Columbia government until after the forest fire hazard is past.

About 1500 men will be engaged in fire fighting, officials said. Only one of five forest fires now is out of control. But higher temperatures and less humid winds increased the hazard.

## Portland Man Suffers Injuries From Fall

PORTLAND, Ore., July 11 (AP)—An 82-year-old man who lay injured for 18 hours beneath the steel bridge here is being treated at a hospital here for spinal injuries.

## Young Forest Fire-Fighters "On Job" In Klamath Woods

One forest fire spotted from three different sources Friday, brought several interesting angles to light.

First, the three calls came in to the office of Klamath Forest Protective association, one right after another, showing the look-outs in the area were right on the job.

Secondly, young George Courtright, lookout at Agency Butte, gave the location exactly, lacking only 135 feet in his calculations from being in the right quarter. The fire was spotted in township 33, range 71, section 2, in the forest above Fort Klamath.

Another point of interest, this was the first experience in answering a fire call by the majority of boys at the Fort Klamath camp. The call was received at 11:55 a. m. The boys threw down the watermelon they were eating, manned the equipment truck and were on their way before you could bat an eye, W. C. Parker, in charge of the camp, reported.

The fire brought to light too, a strange tradition among youthful fire fighters when, after the fire was controlled, notches were cut in points of deer horns. Many a first notch was proudly displayed on a point swinging from the belt. Bob Lee was bragged by his companions as lacking only one notch of becoming an ace. It takes ten notches to become an ace. Lee is a second year fire fighter.

One youth displayed a ringed point with three notches acquired this season. One for the packing plant fire in town, one for the recent Eagle ridge fire, and the Friday fire.

Parker, a discharged Seabee, voiced appreciation of the response and cooperation of the Fort Klamath group. A veteran of three years and three months of overseas duty with the C.B. battalion, Parker spent two years in the South Pacific and one year in Alaska.

Mrs. Margaret Watson, cook and house mother for the 17 boys, reported there was nothing wrong with their appetites. They consume five gallons of whole milk, seven loaves of bread besides hot biscuits, in addition to quantities of meat, vegetables and fresh fruit per day, she said.

Breakfast at camp Saturday morning consisted of mutton chops, fried eggs, hot cakes, fresh fruit and milk. The boys take their lunches to the woods where they work clearing brush and removing fire hazards.

After work is finished for the day, they take a swim and are ready for Mrs. Watson's evening meal of meat, potatoes, gravy, vegetables and pudding, pie or cake.

Each boy takes his turn helping with the dishes, and cleaning up camp. They have one day off per week to do as they like, and swim in all their spare moments.

Boys of the Fort Klamath camp—"the best camp there is"—are Vincent Carter, George Zupan, Cliff Shirley, Charles Sharpe, Ronald Gully, Orval Weaver, Jackie Eitrem, Earl Hannon, Jim Chrisman, Blaine McGillicuddy, Sid Harrington, Hilary White, Tommy Parker, Lester Foster, Gene Dalrymple, Bob Lee and Neil Neilson. McGillicuddy and Harrington are from Eugene, the other boys are all from Klamath Falls.

## ANTI-SOLICITATION ORDINANCE PASSED

After studying the matter of solicitations, the retail trade committee of the chamber of commerce has approved anti-solicitation ordinances now in use in the city and recommended that they be strictly enforced. At present Klamath Falls has the Green River ordinance which prevents soliciting or peddling in residential districts.

This ordinance, which originated in Green River, Wyo., has served as a model for all soliciting ordinances throughout the country. An anti-peddling ordinance is also in use which prevents the sale of merchandise in the business district when there is an actual delivery of merchandise at the time of the sale.

At the meeting of the housing committee a resolution presented by the board of realtors was discussed. The resolution is a request that no further federal housing be planned for Klamath Falls unless something unforeseen should happen. This would not affect the 317 units now under construction, but the board of realtors fears that if more houses are built too many houses will be on the market when the present situation is eased.
