

REDS GIVE UP BERLIN AREAS TO TWO ALLIES

Change in the Russian pattern of rule.

U. S. detachments which had been waiting since midnight of July 4 took over authority in the American zone at 9 a. m. The British got started legally at noon.

American truck convoys were being organized to feed 750,000 Berliners in the U. S. sector from western Germany and the British also assumed responsibility for 900,000 city dwellers.

Berlin's outward life went on undisturbed. Soviet authorized schools were open, communist party district headquarters were as active as ever, bucket brigades of civilians were still picking up rubble stone by stone, and "fraternization" cafes were ready for the mid-afternoon rush of allied and German patrons.

MAJOR'S WIFE RELEASED ON BAIL

BRIDGEPORT, Conn., July 12 (AP)—Mrs. Imogene Stevens, 24, Texas-born wife of Paratrooper Major G. Ralsey Stevens, 3d, posted a bond of \$15,000 today and was liberated from the Fairfield county jail where she has been held since June 24 on a charge of manslaughter in the shooting of a young submarine sailor at New Canaan.

Bond originally was set at \$50,000 in the New Canaan town court where the self-admitted slayer of Albert Kovacs of Norwalk was bound over to the September term of the Fairfield county superior court on a charge of manslaughter.

Mrs. Stevens has been adjudged criminally responsible for the death of the 19-year-old submarine veteran by Coroner Theodore A. Steiber.

The girlish looking brunette mother of a six-year-old daughter by a previous marriage left the courthouse with the major who was home on 30 days leave. Both seemed happy but had nothing to say.

July 14 Sees AEF Dissolved

PARIS, July 12 (AP)—Supreme headquarters allied expeditionary force will be dissolved at 12:01 a. m. on July 14, it was announced today soon after Gen. Eisenhower returned to the continent which his combined command helped free.

The American, British and French forces which served under the supreme commander will then revert to national controls. The SHAEF announcement of its imminent dissolution contained no details.

The mighty allied forces will revert to their own national control and Eisenhower will step over to the command of the Americans and to his place on the inter-allied control council for defeated Germany.

HUNNICUTT CITED

MERRILL — Chief Quartermaster James A. Hunnicutt, U. S. navy, son of Mrs. Mabel Hunnicutt, Merrill, owes his life to a couple of cups of "cold dirty joe" which he was consuming at the time concussion from a blast shattered the magnetic compass he was in charge of on the USS Princeton, in battle in Leyte gulf.

The story of his escape was told during a recent bond show in which he participated in Brownsville, Tex., and clippings reached his mother here this week.

Hunnicutt survived the sinking of the carrier and for his meritorious conduct during the battle he received the Silver Star and for wounds he received the Purple Heart.

He was sitting at his post "getting pretty thirsty" he told his bond audience when he remembered some cold coffee below on the ship. Some dirt had sifted in but after the first cup he decided to have a second and in that brief interim the blast struck that wrecked his instrument.

He has written little of his experiences to his family here but the reporter on the Brownsville paper succeeded in learning that he had earned the Silver Star for getting people out of different parts of the ship, getting some records off the ship and for helping care for the wounded.

He has been in the service for 3 1/2 years and is now stationed at Corpus Christi, Texas.

Prior to entering the service he was employed at McCollum's mill on the Klamath river and for a time at the Lapham ranch at Bly.

His bride, whom he married on his last furlough home several months ago, is serving with the WAC and at present is in San Francisco.

Mrs. Mabel Hunnicutt has four other sons in the service, Vern, last to be inducted who signed for a paratroop division and is now stationed at Camp Wolters, Texas and Robert, Clyde and Glenn serving in the navy.

Mrs. Vern Hunnicutt, the former Helen Reed and two children now reside in Portland. Mrs. Hunnicutt was a former Merrill girl.

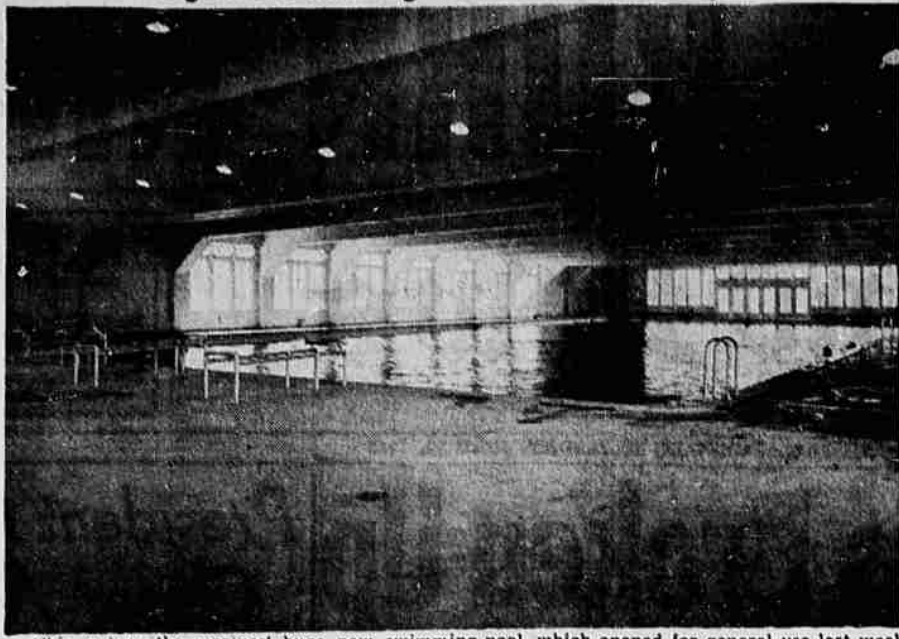
Strike Sabang

A report that 210 planes from British aircraft carriers struck Sabang off the northern end of distant Sumatra yesterday.

The Sumatra area reports are linked with earlier Japanese decision to evacuate unnecessary civilians from the great Singapore naval base at the tip of the Malay peninsula, where the Nipponese expect an invasion in the next few months.

Second Tillamook 2-Hour Battle Wipes Out Nips

PORTLAND, Ore., July 12 (AP) — A second fire was roaring in Tillamook county today, fairly near the region where 575 men were already fighting a stubborn coastal range blaze.

The new fire broke out on the fork of the Wilson river near a small logging operation, and estimates of burned acreage ranged up to 1000 acres. Over 100 men were fighting the flames in the once blackened land of the Tillamook burn.

The earlier blaze which started along the Salmonberry river was being controlled slowly today, foresters said, with crews supplemented by engineer corpsmen from Portland army air base and Camp White, Medford.

Anders Protests Allied Interest

LONDON, July 12 (AP) — Lt. Gen. Wladyslaw Anders, who was appointed by the Polish exile government in London last February as commander of all Polish land, sea and air forces abroad, issued an order of the day today protesting allied recognition of the new Warsaw provisional government.

Anders' action followed by 24 hours a similar order of the day issued by Maj. Gen. Klemens Rudnicki, commander of the first Polish armored division in Germany, declaring his continued allegiance to President Wladyslaw Rackiewicz of the exile regime.

Shoe Stamp 4 Valid August 1

WASHINGTON, July 12 (AP) — The new shoe stamp which becomes valid August 1, will be airplane stamp No. 4, in ration book 3, the office of price administration announced today.

Airplane stamps Nos. 1, 2 and 3 remain valid indefinitely. The new stamp is the first for shoes to become valid since November 1, 1944, when rationing, because of limited stocks of shoes, went off a two-pair-a-year basis.

bombs on Kawasaki, a petroleum center on a reclaimed island in Tokyo bay.

On the island are facilities of the Nippon Oil company, Standard Vacuum Oil company, the Rising Sun Petroleum company and the Mitsui storage depot.

49th Mission

It was the 49th incendiary mission of the Superfortresses and brought their total of Japanese cities hit to 38.

The Kawasaki petroleum center had been bombed April 18, but it was the first raid for the other industrial centers.

The heavy blow was struck after lighter bombers and fighters had carried the air war to the Japanese homeland in quick succession to the big 1000-carrier plane raid on Tokyo airfields Tuesday.

Rip Southern Isles

Bombing and rocket-firing planes ripped southern Japan and its island approaches Wednesday in a fiery followup to the big carrier and land-based air assault on Honshu and a Japanese military commentator told his people that adequate defense of the homeland from invasion required the growing challenge be met.

(The federal communications commission, meanwhile, recorded a Tokyo broadcast that a British carrier task force sent more than 200 planes from two flattops Wednesday morning
