## NAVY SPEEDS UP MAILING EFFORTS

The navy department, realizing that news from home is a great morale builder, is redoubling its efforts to get letters, both V-mail and air mail to men as quickly as possible. Shipping space is at a premium for essential war materials and it is no longer possible to send the millions of home town newspapers and magazines to personnel of the navy, marine corps and coast guard spread over the 5,000,000 square miles of far-flung islands and outposts.

If you want to renew a subscription to a servicemen overseas, for The Herald and News, or other papers and magazines, be sure to have him write requesting renewal before expiration date. Otherwise copies will not be accepted at the post office for mailing, in accordance with a new ruling issued by post office and navy departments.

Another suggestion from the navy is to clip items of interest from The Herald and News and mail them in your letters, saving reading time and valuable cargo space.

Keep sending lots of letters and securely wrapped and care-

fully addressed packages containing no breakables or perishables. Send regularly throughout the year, instead of in the mad scramble just before Christmas.

Newspapers and magazines mailed in fulfillment of subscriptions which are unexpired on the effective date of this order shall be accepted until subscription expires.

## Nip Refuses To Surrender, Allows Swimming By GI's

OKINAWA, July 12 (AP)—A weird truce has been arranged with a Japanese major commanding a garrison on an island off Okinawa whereby he permits Americans to swim and hunt shells on the beach but refuses to surrender "as long as there are no orders from the emperor or his representative."

The truce negotiations with the Japanese commander, who shall be known in this account as Maj. Watanabe, started June 13 when an LCI broadcast an appeal to the island garrison to surrender.

Giving the word to the Japanese were Lt. (j.g.) Henry C. Norton and Lt. (j.g.) D. L. Osborn, Japanese language officers, and two captured Japanese officers (known in this account as Lt. Abe and Lt. Nomura).

Lt. Osborn volunteered and swam ashore, planting three white flags with instructions that one flag was to be left standing if no negotiations were wanted and two left standing if a personal interview was desired.

Next day two flags were flying. The Japanese commander

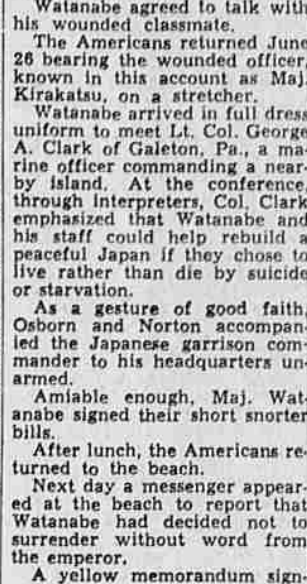
