PROCESSED FOODS

Mosquito Purge Rids Portland Area

PORTLAND, July 14 (AP)—Portlanders sighed gratefully today at a bureau of insect control announcement that this area's mosquito plague is on the wane.

Supervisor E. G. Gavin reported flood-water mosquitoes are fast dying after an unusually busy season. The culex variety of mosquito, which breeds in pools and drainage ditches, is now being controlled by diesel-sprayers who cover the county thoroughly once a week, he said. The spraying will continue through August.
