OUTLET TO OCEAN
WASHINGTON, July 18 (AP)—Russia's age-old quest for her own trade outlets to the open ocean may come close to fulfillment at the Berlin Big Three conference.

Diplomatic authorities here believe the question of ocean traffic bottlenecks which allow other countries to control all the best passages to the soviet union may occupy a prominent position at the Potsdam discussions.

These bottlenecks include the Yellow sea approaches to Russia's Siberian back door. The prospect is that regardless of talk or lack of talk about soviet participation in the war against Japan, there will be a fairly full exploration of Russia's political intentions in eastern Asia.

Port Arthur Question
These intentions are believed to be dominated to a considerable extent by Russia's commercial aspirations in the Pacific. Involved directly is the question of Port Arthur. Russia once took a 99-year lease on that north China port, and Premier Stalin generally is expected to demand its use again.

But neither Port Arthur nor any other outlet that far south is likely to have any security unless the Russians control approaches to it. For that reason, and several others, President Truman is anxious to find out Stalin's general ideas on the future of east Asia regardless of what Russia does about the war. Similarly the question of disposition of Japanese islands in the North Pacific is likely to come up. Russia is expected to claim Karafuto, the southern half of Russian-held Sakhalin. But ships moving to the Asiatic mainland have to go through passages in the Japanese chain or in the Kuriles to the north. As a result there has been speculation that Stalin might want one of these passages to have Russian-held islands.

POCATELLO, Ida., July 18 (AP)—Next time Vernon Van Duyn decides to "park" on a downtown street he'll do more than put a nickel in the meter—he'll bring his car with him.

Monday Van Duyn was fined \$15 by local Judge Charles A. Brown after arresting officers testified that they found the defendant sitting on a curb shooting motorists away from his parking place. eral telegrams of protest have already gone to him and to the CAB.

PORTLAND, July 18 (AP)—United Airlines said today it would continue its appeal for permission to include Klamath Falls as a stopover point between San Francisco and Portland.

A civil aeronautics board examiner at Washington yesterday recommended the airline include only Bend as an intermediate point. The examiner said he refused to include other cities because traffic was insufficient to justify both through and local carrier. If through planes tapped smaller points, the examiner said, the local carrier would be unable to operate.

Final decision is up to the civil aeronautics board itself. "We are going to continue to apply for Klamath Falls until we get it," the airlines' public relations office said here. "We are also going to continue applying for Baker, Astoria and Coos Bay."

than a score of cities. But, unlike the coal miners and foundry workers, their walkouts and strikes stemmed from labor disputes, and not in protest over meat shortages.

The expected return to work by the miners and foundry workers would reduce the number of idle throughout the country to the lowest figure in the past several days. The first group of miners quit their jobs last Friday in protest of a shortage of meat and others have followed. Leaders had protested they "can't dig coal on lettuce sandwiches."

The miners had demanded 50 extra red points per man a month. An OPA spokesman in Washington said a detailed announcement of the program probably would be made within a few days. He said the plan now being perfected was in line with the policy of providing extra meat and other foods for those engaged in hard physical jobs.
