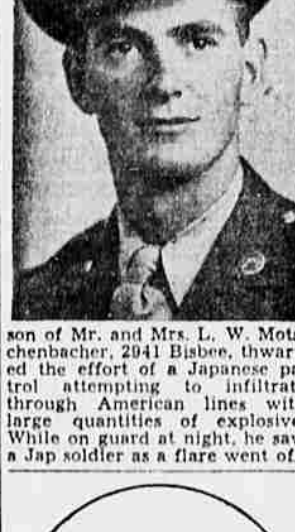
60-DAY LEAVE
Lt. Steven G. Nason is getting acquainted with his 17-month-old son, Steven Jr., which he saw for the first time in July. Lt. Nason, who was taken prisoner by the Germans a year and a half ago, was among the last prisoners to be freed by the allies. He was in Stauling Luft 1 in Berlin, Germany, after the B-17 in which he was 1st pilot caught fire over enemy territory. He was awarded the Presidential Citation, the Air Medal, and the Purple Heart for burns received on face and hands.

James A. Wicks of 124 Jefferson was commissioned as ensign, USMS, in graduation exercises last week at the U. S. Maritime Service Officers school, Alameda, Calif. After successfully completing a four months' course and passing examinations for licenses, the new officers, along with a class of almost 200 officer candidates, were presented with their commissions by Capt. Malcolm E. Crossman, USMS, superintendent. It was necessary for the men to have at least 14 months' sea experience in order to qualify for entrance. They will ship out as third mates or third assistant engineers on merchant vessels within a few weeks of graduation.

Do you know this about Summer Desserts

Desserts for Summer should be light-textured, time-saving and eye-appealing. This delicious sponge-like cake with its colorful whip topping is one tempting example. And the delectable Fruit Pockets make for welcome variety.

FAIRY SPONGE CAKE

1 cup all-purpose flour	1 cup sugar
1 tsp. baking powder	1 tsp. vanilla
1/4 tsp. salt	1/2 cup hot milk
2 eggs	1 tbsp. butter or margarine

Sift and measure flour; sift again with baking powder and salt. Beat eggs well with rotary beater; add sugar gradually and continue beating until mixture is very light. Add dry ingredients and stir until smooth. Add flavoring. Heat milk to boiling; add butter or margarine; stir quickly into batter. Pour immediately into 9-inch well-greased and floured cake pan and bake in moderate oven (350° F.) about 20 minutes or until done. Remove from pan; cool on rack. Serve topped with Fresh Fruit or Berry Whip. (Recipe follows.)

FRESH FRUIT WHIP
Soften 1 tablespoon unflavored gelatin in 1/4 cup cold water, then dissolve in 1/2 cup hot water. Combine 1/4 cup sugar, 1 1/2 cups crushed fruit or berries, 1/4 tsp. salt, and 2 tbsps. lemon juice; add to gelatin. Chill until thick and syrupy; beat with rotary beater until foamy. Fold in stiffly beaten whites of 2 eggs. Chill until firm.

FRUIT POCKETS
Use your favorite biscuit dough recipe. Roll dough about 1/4 inch thick; cut into six 4-inch squares. Place about 1/2 cup sweetened fresh berries or sliced fruit in center of squares. Fold over diagonally; press edges together well with fork. Prick top to allow steam to escape. Bake in hot oven (450° F.) 15 minutes; reduce heat to moderately hot (400° F.) and continue baking 15 minutes longer or until done.
