

New York Nicks Ferriss For 10 Hits; Win, 4-2, Tigers Rap Browns, 5-4

Nobody can convince Dave Ferriss that the New York Yankees are just a shadow of the old murderer's row and the rookie of the year has evidence to back up his case.

The spectacular Boston Red Sox freshman has lost only four games while winning 17, but three of his setbacks were at the hands of the New Yorkers.

When the discharged air force veteran broke into the league with eight straight triumphs, including a 5-0 shutout of the Yanks, the writers went scurrying for the record books to excavate matching deeds.

Next time the husky righthander came up against the Yanks he was slugged off the hill, the only time he has been kayoed in 20 starts, and soundly drubbed, 14-4, by Walter Dubiel.

Ferriss Edged Out
The prize rookie had lost only once since and Dubiel hadn't beaten a soul since that June 21 day until yesterday when they again clashed at Fenway park.

Ferriss wasn't knocked out or even close but the New York team combed him for 10 hits, four by Tucker Stainback, and edged him out in 10 innings, 4-2.

Hal Newhouser pulled up even with Ferriss at the 17-win pole by turning back the champion St. Louis Browns in 12 heats, 5-4. Jimmy Outley's single with the bases loaded scored the lefthander who had led off the third overtime inning with a single.

Cleveland moved into fifth place by notching its seventh triumph in the last eight starts, nosing out Chicago, 6-5, in a night game. Superb relief chucking by Pete Center who picked up his fourth successive decision without defeat, lifted the Indians up past the White Sox in the league standings.

Washington and Philadelphia were washed out of a two-night doubleheader. Split will play two tonight.

Braves Split With Giants
Boston's new manager, Del Bissonette, got his first taste of the troubles that caused Bob Coleman to resign as the Boston Braves sank to their 10th straight defeat by bowing to the New York Giants, 4-3, in the first game of a doubleheader.

Relief Pitcher Mort Cooper walked three men in a row to force in the tying run before Phil Weintraub broke it up. The nightcap threatened to be a similar story when the Giants rallied to tie in the ninth but the Braves snapped out of it with five in the 13th to grab a 9-4 even break.

St. Louis missed a chance to regain second place by losing to Cincinnati's Bucky Walters, 2-0 in the second game after grabbing the opener, 4-3 as Al Jurisich pitched his first complete game and initial victory of the campaign.

Brooklyn and the Phillies were rained out of a doubleheader and Pittsburgh and Chicago were not scheduled.

Seattle's Rainiers, off to a flying start against San Francisco by virtue of a 2-0 win last night, stowed two wishes in their Pacific league "hope chest" today—victory for themselves and the cellar-dwelling Hollywood Stars.

Whether the second-place Rainiers can overhaul the top spot, Portland Beavers hinges heavily on the Hollywood-Portland series which gets underway with a doubleheader tonight. Seattle's triumph Tuesday moved the skiffmen within five and a half games of the pace-setters.

Solons Take Third
Only change in the standings resulted from Sacramento's 7-3 decision over the Los Angeles Angels, moving the Solons into third half a tilt ahead of the Seals. In second division contests the Oakland Aorns split a twin bill with the San Diego Padres, the Oaks winning the curtain raiser 11-8 and dropping the nightcap 1-2.

Seattle's satisfaction in blanking San Francisco was more than statistical, since only last week Seal Skipper "Lefty" O'Doul classed the Rainiers as strictly a second-rate club. The game was a pitcher's battle, with Southpaw Chet Johnson edging out Right-hander Frankie Seward. Both gave up 11 hits. The northerners got to Seward for their brace of runs in the sixth inning as First Baseman George McDonald and Third Sacker Charley Aleno singled and came home on Shortstop Joe Dobbins' triple.

Fletcher Wins
Sacramento's ace righthander, Guy Fletcher, had little trouble setting the Angels down, 7-3. The Solons were never headed after jumping into a two-run lead in the first inning on doubles by Gene Handley and George Mandish, and a single by Jo-Jo White. The defeat, Los Angeles' fourth in a row, was charged to Paul Lammers.

Bruins Loom As National Loop Champs

CHICAGO, Aug. 1 (AP)—The super-charged Chicago Cubs, who have "Borowy'd" new strength, appear favored by the schedule-makers to head the National league parade the remaining two months of the season.

The Bruins wind up one of their most successful home stands in several years today and tomorrow against the Pittsburgh Pirates, but a 21-game road trip they begin Friday should cause them no worry.

The jaunt pits them against the Cincinnati Reds whom they have trimmed 13 times in 13 starts this season, and Boston, Philadelphia, Brooklyn and New York who contributed 13 victories in 16 starts to the Cubs on their last eastern swing.

Aided by Hank Borowy, whose acquisition from the New York Yankees continues to mystify and rattle the rest of the majors, the Cubs would have to do an unexpected tail-spin to dissipate their current six-game lead over the St. Louis Cardinals and Brooklyn Dodgers.
