plan another meeting today — and there was speculation it may be their last.

The meeting likely will be preceded by another get-together by U. S. Secretary of State James F. Byrnes, Russian foreign minister Vyacheslav M. Molotov and British Foreign Secretary Ernest Bevin. Another conference of committees made up of the staffs of the three delegations also was expected.

Solid Foundation
A spokesman said "a great deal of progress was made" by the three leaders at a 34 hour meeting yesterday.

The conference's survival of the defeat of the government of Prime Minister Churchill, one of the original Big Three, apparently demonstrated the solid foundation for decisions which had been reached.

It is expected the results of the parley will be announced in a joint communique to be released simultaneously in London, Washington and Moscow.

"Laval gave me the impression he was a tired old man," said Capt. Robert C. Woodbury, Fort Worth, Tex., who talked with Laval and his wife after they landed. He said they were shabbily dressed and camera shy as American signal corps photographers surrounded them. Laval carried \$10,000 in American bills.

Pilots Jailed
The two Luftwaffe men who piloted the plane were jailed over protests they had been assured before leaving that the Americans would permit them to return to Spain.

Laval was entirely at ease, Maj. William Gleason, Ogden, Utah, of 65th division headquarters, said. The Vichy chief's first question was about the state of politics in France but Gleason said he forbade further conversation.

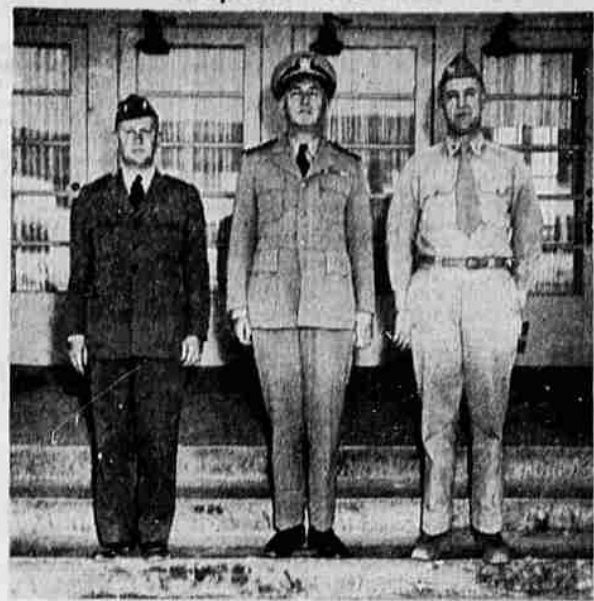

had heard Petain express a desire to see the nazis overwhelmed.

After the letter was read, Chief Judge Mongibeaux asserted: "There is one sentence against Petain in that letter."

Leahy's letter said that while he was ambassador to France "you did, on occasion at my request, take action in opposition to the desires of the axis and favorable to the allied cause."

"On every instance when you failed to accept my recommendations to oppose the axis powers by refusing their demands, you stated the reason was that such positive action by you would result in additional oppression of our people by the invaders," the admiral continued.

Main Concerns
"I had then, as I have now, the conviction that your principal concern was the welfare and protection of the helpless people of France. It was impossible for me to believe that you had any other concern."

"However, I must in all honesty repeat my opinion, as expressed to you at the time, that positive refusal to make any concessions to axis demands, while it might have brought immediately increased hardship to your people, would in the long view have been advantageous to France."

EMBARGO LIFTED

KANSAS CITY, Aug. 1 (AP)—An embargo on wheat shipments into Kansas City, effective since last Thursday, was lifted yesterday.

F. S. Keiser, Washington, a representative of the office of defense transportation, said all restrictions were lifted after the number of cars on the track, awaiting unloading, dropped to 3264. The embargo was ordered because of the large number of cars tied up in the yards awaiting unloading.

astounding total of enemy ship and plane destruction.

The fleet air arm knocked out 1035 vessels and 1278 planes since July 10.

Land based planes operating under Admiral Nimitz added 260 ships and surface craft and 53 planes.

The far eastern air forces contributed 250 more ships since they moved up to Okinawa.

Totals High
The totals included well over 100 warships, ranging from battleships and carriers down to midget submarines and PT boats. They also include many types of craft such as tugs and coastal vessels. And large numbers of both ships and planes were only damaged and will have to be hit again.

Other Tolls
However, the figures do not include tolls taken off the China coast, in the southwest Pacific, in southeast Asia or China. For example, General MacArthur today listed 11 craft sunk off the Malay coast and Borneo which were not included in the 250 total of the Far East air force command.

Latest total reported for his forces operating in Japanese waters was 24, including two destroyers and two 6000-ton freighter-transports.

The toll credited to Admiral Halsey's forces was raised with a recapitulation of Monday's heavy air strike at the Malizuru naval base, across Honshu island from Tokyo. Carrier pilots accounted for 68 ships and surface craft and 227 planes there.

Sub Bombards
Tokyo reported that the blazing guns of a single American submarine wound up July with a 30 minute bombardment last night of Tomakomai on the northern refuge island of Hokkaido.

Twenty Mustang fighters from two Okinawa were credited by Tokyo radio with making the first attack in August. They raked airfields and transportation facilities in the heavily hammered Osaka-kobe area for 50 minutes today.

Japan is taking such a beating that a Tokyo broadcaster moaned "we are enduring the impossible, with grinding teeth and clenched fist."

dictments by the grand jury of Klamath county.

Hearing Of Juror Issue
The motions alleged that John M. Anderson, a member of the grand jury, was not in possession of all his faculties at the time of the indictments and was unable to hear the testimony given by witnesses and that his eyesight was so impaired that he was unable to recognize any witnesses that testified before him at that time.

They also claimed that B. S. Grigsby, foreman of the grand jury, was talked to by Circuit Court Judge David R. Vandenberg, Klamath county, about the alleged offenses mentioned in the indictments and that Grigsby was imperturbed by Vandenberg to return the indictments against Heuvel.

The motions alleged that Judge Vandenberg has publicly stated on times and occasions "too numerous to mention" that

"I am after the above named defendant and will get him and throw the book at him," meaning to imply that Vandenberg was going to see that the defendant was indicted and convicted and receive a heavy sentence regardless of the defendant's guilt or innocence."

Welch's statement charged that prior to the investigation of Heuvel by the grand jury, Earl W. Tichenor, sergeant of Oregon state police, interviewed a great number of citizens in Klamath county in an effort to create public sentiment against Heuvel for the purpose of securing indictments against him. Tichenor was alleged to have said, "We, (meaning Vandenberg and himself) are out to get Earl Heuvel."

The motions state finally that the indictments were not found, endorsed, or presented as prescribed by Oregon law and the indictments were returned by an illegally constituted grand jury and that undue influence and pressure were exerted upon the grand jury by two public officials in an effort to secure the indictment.
