

October Return Will Place Many Tasks Before Senate

WASHINGTON, Aug. 1 (AP)—Majority Leader Barkley told a session-bound senate today it faces a dozen urgent domestic legislative tasks when it returns in October.

Some represent direct requests from President Truman; others are carryovers from the program of Franklin D. Roosevelt which was embraced by the new chief executive without reservation.

The nation's No. 1 task, of course, is to defeat Japan, Barkley declared. At the same time, he invited the lawmakers to consider during the recess these other "pressing problems":

1. Legislation authorizing the president to reorganize the agen-

2. Widening of unemployment compensation coverage, with increased benefits during the re-conversion period and supplementary federal payments to create a national minimum standard.
3. Comprehensive housing legislation.
4. Creation of a single surplus property administrator, instead of a board.
5. Full employment legislation.
6. Reduction of taxes as soon as practicable.
7. Broadening of the social security law.
8. Elimination of cartels and monopolies.
9. Financial aid by government to business.
10. Water power development.
11. Highway improvement and construction.
12. Study of Mr. Roosevelt's proposed "economic bill of rights."

As for taxes, Barkley observed that the federal government collected \$45,000,000,000 in income taxes on individuals and corporations last year, an amount he said he did not think necessary after the defeat of Japan. He estimated that from \$20,000,000,000 to \$22,000,000,000 a year would be necessary to carry on government after the war.

In what has been termed a honeymoon period between the legislative and executive branches, Barkley found that congress approved important foreign affairs measures such as the international monetary agreements, reciprocal trade revision and the United Nations charter.

But in the first 100 days of the new presidential regime it didn't do much about putting into effect some of the domestic suggestions Mr. Truman made.

Barkley listed these, along with unacted-upon proposals made by the late President Roosevelt, in a program he planned to tell the senate must be considered when members return in October from a vacation starting tomorrow.

Although Barkley said he began working on the idea a week ago, his list was regarded as something of an answer to the move by senate left wingers to rally support behind what they call "progressive" reconversion legislation.

Barkley could call attention, for instance, to Mr. Truman's proposal that unemployment compensation be increased and maintained on a nationwide level during the reconversion period. Congress hasn't done anything about that.

The president also asked for power to reorganize the executive departments. And he wanted revision of the surplus property setup to place it under one administrator.

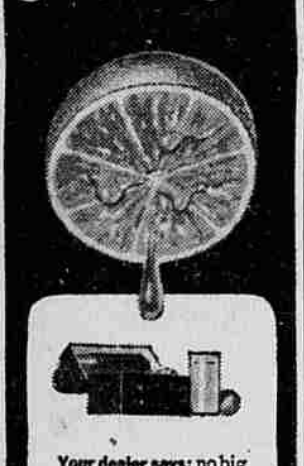
