SUNDAY SCHOOL INAUGURATES BUS SERVICE

How to make coffee ice cream

Scald a cup of M.J.B. with one-third cup of M.J.B. Strain this carefully, then add a teaspoon of gelatin which has been soaked in a little cold milk. Add half a cup of sugar and stir. Let the mixture chill and then pour it into a refrigerator tray. After it has become mushy, beat it until light, then mix in a cup of cream which has been beaten until it's thick—but not stiff. Return to the refrigerator. It needs no further stirring while it freezes.
