# NAZI SUB CREW HELD IN MIAMI

MIAMI, Fla., Aug. 3 (AP)—Fourteen crew members of the Nazi submarine U-530 which was rumored to have put Adolph Hitler and his mistress, Eva Braun, ashore before surrendering to Argentine authorities July 10, today were prisoners of war in a compound here.

Reports current after the capitulation of the U-boat at Mari Del Plata brought a denial from Admiral Eberhard Godt, operations chief for the former German undersea fleet, that the Nazi dictator or his mistress had been aboard the sub.
