

CASCARA BARK GETS RECORD PRICE RISE

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 7 (AP)—Cascara bark dealers were offering 30 cents a pound—an all-time high—here today, and finding inadequate supplies.

Harold G. Russell of Pacific coast Cascara Bark company, said unprecedented demand for medical supplies plus a drop in offerings caused the price increase. The normal price is around 10 cents a pound.

Normal production of the northwest—the only place in the world where it is produced—is about four million pounds a year, Russell said. The 1944 peel was about two million pounds, and production for this year will be still lower, he added.

LIGHTNING STORMS SKIP KLAMATH AREA

Lightning storms which hit some parts of Oregon yesterday steered away from the Klamath area with the exception of a few strikes in the Lake o' the Woods country.

A report of a blaze in the Aspen lake area south and east of Lake o' the Woods was being checked Tuesday afternoon by KFPA and crews had been sent out.

Another man-caused fire was reported on the Klamath Indian reservation about 10 miles east of Chiloquin, but it was put out after it had covered about a quarter of an acre.

The city fire department was out on three calls Monday afternoon and evening, none of them serious. At about 3 o'clock they were called to Lytton street to put out a small grass fire and later they took equipment to a grass blaze on Hank's street in the Shippington district.

At 10 o'clock Monday night they were called to 549 Old Fort road where an old grass fire had started to blaze again and had set fire to an old chicken shed. There was not much damage.

President Faces Home Problems

WASHINGTON, Aug. 7 (AP)—President Truman, nearing home today with a satchel full of international agreements, will find the domestic pot boiling with problems.

First off Mr. Truman must complete his manuscript for the radio report to the nation he is expected to make within the next day or two on what happened when he sat down with Generalissimo Stalin, Prime Minister Attlee and former Prime Minister Churchill.

The Big Three Potsdam communique left unanswered such questions as the use to which German prisoners are to be put, how European relief will be handled and whether newsmen actually are going to be permitted to report on what happens inside Poland and the Balkan countries.

Bonanza Jail Plans Formed

Plans are now being formulated for a new jail at Bonanza and \$1000 has been allotted of county money, according to the county court office.

The city of Bonanza will furnish the site and the utilities and will furnish any money needed above the amount given by the county.

The new jail will facilitate the work of the county law officers as culprits will not have to be brought to the county jail in Klamath Falls for minor offenses.

NEW WEAPON TO BE WAR-ENDING, WORLD-SHAPING

States is fully prepared to go ahead with the bombings.

Moreover future attacks shortly may be intensified, for Mr. Truman disclosed that new and even more powerful atomic bombs are in the making.

The president and Secretary of War Stimson gave little detail of the new weapon except that the size of the explosive charge is exceedingly small. A London commentator reported that the bomb is only one-tenth the size of the blockbuster, although some observers here believe it may be heavy and bulky because of the apparatus needed to touch off the charge.

Peacetime Woes

Effects of atomic energy use in peacetime:

At the moment the use of this new weapon is securely in the hands of the allies, Stimson said the war department is certain the Japanese cannot match it. But it is expected that in future years every great industrial nation will develop it.

Military authorities already are talking of the possibility that the United States could be attacked by atomic rockets launched either from Europe or Asia. Some expect to use this as a new and dramatic argument, when congress returns, for enactment of national service legislation.

Future Attack

The contention will be made that should such an attack occur in some future generation this country would need millions of trained citizens capable of taking control to prevent panic, to organize security and to prepare for resistance and counter-attack. In the war of the future, these authorities say, an enemy ready for quick conquest probably would seek to followup atomic rocket attacks by parachute invasion of key cities.

However, Senator Johnson (D-Colo.), a member of the military committee, told interviewers at Denver last night "the atomic bomb ought to blow up peacetime conscription... It ought to mean the end of big armies."

PARIS, Aug. 7 (AP)—Jean Fernet told the court trying Marshal Pétain for his life today that the old soldier approved secret negotiations with Great Britain in 1940 shortly after the French-German armistice.

He said the marshal approved the visit to England of Louis Rougier, and that he returned from conferences with former Prime Minister Churchill and former Foreign Secretary Anthony Eden with a working agreement.

Much Decorated

This was the end, then for the Poplar, Wis., boy who had earned 26 decorations, including the Congressional Medal of Honor and the British Distinguished Flying Cross, the latter presented to him by King George VI of England. In addition to his 40 kills, he had nine probables in two years of combat in the South Pacific, mostly over New Guinea.

Bong joined the air forces in May, 1941, after attending Superior, Wis., State Teachers college, where he met his future wife, Marjorie Ann Yatonahai. He received his second lieutenant's wings at Luke field, Arizona, in January, 1942, and was overseas that fall.

Nazi Prisoners Moved For Trials

LONDON, Aug. 7 (AP)—Top ranking nazis held as prisoners of war will be moved shortly from Mondorf Luxembourg, to the Nuernberg jail, where they will be held for the approaching major war crimes trial, it was disclosed today.

They will lose their status as war prisoners and be held without bail as civil criminals.

Highway Junction Taken By Chinese

CHUNGKING, Aug. 7 (AP)—Chinese troops have captured Yeungkong, Kwangtung province highway junction close to the South China sea and 125 miles southwest of Canton, and are driving the Japanese toward Yanping, 32 miles to the northeast, the Chinese high command announced today.

The capture of Yeungkong tightened the Chinese grip on a 50-mile stretch of the Chinese invasion coast west of Hong Kong.

were "wasting the public's money," Rogers said. "As a matter of fact, the \$350,000,000 spent on this project was very reasonable."

High military personnel from western points flocked into Richland today for a first "peek" at the mysterious Hanford project.

Army engineers were tickled at the appearance of naval officers.

"It looks as though the navy's coming in to see what we've been holding out on them," said a project officer.

Lt. M. C. Cydell, public relations officer and former Seattle newspaperman, who for months has had the job of "suppress officer," today found his task that of satisfying the curiosity of newsmen from many Washington and Oregon points.

He explained that up to a late hour last night the war department had given local officials no authority to release details of atomic bomb production other than an escorted tour of Richland itself.

Col. Matthias is making every effort to obtain permission to take the press into the production areas," Lt. Cydell said. "If this is granted, the tour will extend into four or five days. It is a big place."

Col. Matthias told newsmen last night that if Japanese scientists had beaten American and British atom breakers to this discovery, "we would be behind the eight ball instead of the Japs."

The 37-year-old commander, a native of Wisconsin, lauded Richland workers for their careful conduct through the three secret years of construction, which he said had cost \$350,000,000.
