SEATTLE, Aug. 9 (P)—The Tacoma franchise in the Western International league may be acquired by Brooklyn of the National league or San Francisco of the Pacific Coast circuit, Roger Peck, present owner, informed the Post-Intelligencer last night.

Peck was reported as saying Tom Downey of the Brooklyn system had asked him if the club was available.

"We have always worked closely with Charley Graham at San Francisco and he will get first call on the franchise," Peck was quoted as saying. "Of course, I might not sell. Unless the terms are satisfactory I will continue to operate the team."

The article reported Aberdeen, Hoquiam, Wenatchee, Yakima, Lewiston, Victoria and Bellingham are seeking spots in the loop. Active franchises are held now in Tacoma, Spokane, Vancouver, B. C. and Salem.

Pro Football Goes Ahead Despite ODT Disapproval

WASHINGTON, Aug. 9 (P)—Professional football went ahead today with original training plans even though the ODT "disapproved" 13 non-championship games in September.

Elmer Layden, National league commissioner, "feeling much better" about the situation, told a reporter that "we have to go right ahead and get the boys in shape." His attitude was that the games have "not been called off" by the office of defense transportation stand.

Col. J. Monroe Johnson, ODT director, said in announcing disapproval of the non-championship games, that he would be willing to "re-examine the question" prior to the scheduled dates "in the light of the then-existing transportation situation."

Layden and other football men saw in this the possibility of playing some if not all of the non-championship games if Japan should surrender soon.

Some of the league teams, including the Washington Redskins, will start workouts next week.

Layden's reaction to Johnson's statement, based on ODT's policy of permitting only regularly

scheduled games in all types of sports, was:

"The situation looks encouraging and I'm very glad the games were not called off as owners had made very drastic cuts in travel approximating 1,000,000 miles or one-third of their 1944 travel as well as reducing their number of games."

stops in Sprague River, Malin, Ewauna and Big Lakes, and Klamath Falls. The unit on Wednesday was in Chiloquin and on Thursday will be at Fork Klamath and will stop in Gilchrist on August 10 and in Shevlin on August 13.

In Klamath Falls there were 1187 pictures taken with the heaviest day on Tuesday, in one hour on Tuesday, 111 people had free chest X-rays.
