MILTON-FREEWATER, Ore., Aug. 15 (AP)—The first shipment of early prunes left the valley this week and the harvest has been advanced ten days.

This year's crop is estimated between 1500 and 1700 cars, about 25 per cent more than last year. For the first time, part of the crop will be frozen.
