

MIGRANT WAR WORKERS HEAD TOWARDS HOME

SEATTLE, Aug. 22 (AP)—A lengthening exodus of trailer-living migrant war workers—headed back to their midwest homes or seeking greener pastures—has been steadily reducing trailer settlements here to ghost camps since the war's end.

Some of them are going back to their homes in Muskogee, Okla., Honey Grove, Tex., Van Hook, N. D. Others, having lost their jobs here because of reconversion, are going on to California to see if they can find work.

Many have managed to save some money and now want "a little home and a piece of land." For months and years, families of three or four persons have been living in 18- to 22-foot trailers, often utilizing the back seat of an automobile for extra sleeping space.

Families who plan to stay are selling their trailers and having no trouble doing so, since the demand is large for "anything on wheels." The state license department today reported a lively increase in sale of licenses to owners of house and luggage trailers, with a total of 9169 licenses issued thus far this year.

MAN BURNS HANDS EXHIBITING BOMB

MERRILL—Henry Johnson, employed on the West and Lyons ranch, picked up a metal cylinder on burned-over peat ground on Lower Klamath lake near here.

Fastened to the metal by interlocking hooks was an unexploded rifle shell, minus the lead slug.

He removed a substance from the base of the cylinder and reassembled the parts. Later while exhibiting his find to two companions the shell exploded, inflicting minor burns on his hand.

Johnson, familiar with trapping practices, believes the explosive to be a cyanide bomb set for coyotes.

SEVERE RATION FOR POSTWAR ENGLAND

LONDON, Aug. 22 (AP)—Britishers, under stringent clothing and sugar rations for the past six years, will get even fewer garments and sweets during the next rationing period.

The adult clothing ration will continue at 24 coupons, but these must last for eight months instead of the usual six-month period. A new suit takes 26 coupons, which means that a man must have saved two coupons from the last period and must forego all other clothing.

The sugar ration will remain at two pounds per person per month. There will be less ice cream, preserves and confections, and less sugar for brewers.

GRAND JURY HEARS PEACE RIOT FACTS

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 22 (AP)—Six women were raped and 1059 people treated for injuries during the three-night San Francisco peace riots last week, District Attorney Edmund G. Brown told a grand jury last night.

The jury voted to continue with the fact-finding inquiry after Brown had reported on investigations of the wild celebration in which mobs broke plate-glass windows valued at more than \$25,000.

The district attorney did not mention fatal accidents in which 12 persons lost their lives. His statement that six women had been raped aroused particular interest, since no report of such occurrences had been made by the police department.
